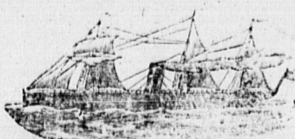

Final Sailings Black Diamond Line Steamers from Montreal to Ch'town this season.



The S. S. Bonavista is expected to sail from Montreal on or about Nov. 22nd, for Ch'town direct.

She will be due here about the 25th inst., and sails for St John's Newfoundland via Sydneys and North Sydney C. B., carrying horses, cattle and sheep on deck and produce underdeck at lowest possible rates. This will be the last sailing of B. D. Steamers from Montreal to Ch'town this season.

The S. S. Cacouna will be due at Ch'town from Sydney, C. B., about the 26th inst. with a full cargo of coal to Peake Bros & Co.

Should a sufficient quantity of freight offer this steamer will go on the berth about Nov. 30th and load a full general cargo of hay, oats, potatoes, vegetables, butter, eggs, cheese underdeck and horses, cattle and sheep on deck for St. John's, Newfoundland.

—The latest news first of all.

—Angus McKinnon, Cleman, was in Summerside yesterday.

—The Prince County roads are drying up now and produce is beginning to come in faster.

—Richard Cameron and daughter, Miss Ella, Crapaud, were in Summerside yesterday.

—Councillor Silliphant, Summerside, left yesterday for a short trip to Boston.

—The schooners Scotia, Falcon and Annie D., are loading in Summerside with produce for Halifax.

—A man by the name of Gallant was before the Police Court yesterday and paid two dollars and costs for drinking to much whiskey.

—Herbert and Mrs Lowther, Crapaud, were in Summerside yesterday and went to Lot 16, where they will visit with friends for a few days.

—There were six tons of smelts brought to Summerside, yesterday morning, from the west by express, and placed on board the Empress for Boston.

—Miss Myra Ellis, professional nurse, Boston, left yesterday on return to her home after spending a few weeks vacation with her parents, K. and Mrs Ellis, Summerside.

—Miss Hayden, professional nurse of Boston, arrived by the Empress Monday evening and proceeded to Vernon River, in response to a telegram announcing the serious illness of her sister, Miss Adele.

—The schooner maid Weston, Captain Weston, is discharging lumber at Summerside. Capt Weston has made twenty-seven round trips between Richibucto, Miramichi and Summerside this season Capt Weston is a hustler.

—On Sunday night last the barn of Alex White, Elmsdale, was burned to ashes, together with a quantity of hay, straw and oats, which he had stored to feed his stock during the coming winter. The cause of the fire is unknown.

—In Summerside yesterday dealers were paying: 22 to 23 cents a doz for eggs; \$8.50 a ton for loose hay; \$4.50 for straw; 20 to 25 cents per lb for butter; 20c a bus for potatoes; 39 to 40 cents per bus for oats and 8 to 8 1/2 cents per lb for pork.

—Alberton dealers are paying 37 cents a bus for white oats and 38 cents for black; 21 cents a dozen for eggs; 20 cents a lb for butter; 19 cts a bus for potatoes; 10 cents a lb for hides; 8 to 8 1/2 cents a lb for pork; 10 cents per lb for geese; 13 cents a bus for turnips and \$8 a ton for loose hay.

—Yesterday afternoon about four o'clock, there was a fire alarm called in Summerside, to which the firemen quickly responded. The fire originated from a pile of ashes thrown out at the rear of the fine new residence of the late R. W. Sharpe. The steps leading up to the rear door were partly burnt, otherwise there was no further damage. A strong wind was blowing straight on the main house at the time.
