### MAJOR HOLLAND'S SURVEY.

There is, we believe, no one resident in this Province so well-informed in regard to the various surveys of Prince Edward Island as our esteemed fellow-citizen Henry Cundall, whose accurate map has formed the starting point and basis of all subsequent maps and much of the topographical information in regard to our Province that is so far available. In a private note to the editor, and which we take the liberty of printing, Mr. Cundall says:

"Major Holland's survey of this Island, was merely a survey of the coasts of the sea and rivers, and he did not run the boundary lines of the Townships, except on his plan of paper, and therefore I feel sure that his knowledge of the quality of the soil of each Township was derived from the land he met with while surveying the sea and river coasts, the small clearances and occasional carrying places of the French. As you say, his remarks now need revision.

"Robert Fox was one of the early surveyors, who ran Township lines, but owing to the change in the variation of the magnetic needle, his lines were not exactly in accord with those laid down by Major Holland on his plan.

"In order that the boundary lines should be run in accordance with Major Holland's plan, an act was passed by the Island Legislature in the year 1834, for ascertaining and establishing the boundary lines of counties and Townships and three commissioners,—one the Surveyor General—were appointed to carry out the directions of the Act.

A correspondent writes The Guardian that 2,300 commercial travellers visit the Maritime Provinces yearly, of whom only 400 come to Prince Edward Island, many of them being kept away by the tax

imposed here. This correspondent avers that if the tax were removed a thousand more of the commercial men would come to our shores, spending on an average \$3 each while here, a total of \$30,000. We have not verified these figures, and give them for what they are worth, but if true they would go to show that for the seven or eight thousand dollars which the Government gets in taxes from the knights of the grip-sack, six times as much is lost in the yearly receipts by the people from the visits of these hustling and agreeable commercial men.
