The death occurred in this city on Dec. 21st after an illness of over two years of Mr. James MacPhee age fifty-one years. He leaves to mourn besides a widow, four daughters, Mrs. H. Crabbe, Misses, Mrs. H. A. MacPhadyen, St. John, Miss Euphemia and Miss Jean and one son, William W. of this city. The late Mr. MacPhee was born near Riverdale, Ont. and afterwards lived for several years at Kingston, previous to his removal to Charlottetown where he was well known as proprietor of the Savoy House. He was a man of sterling integrity and upright Christian character and he passed to his Eternal reward trusting in the merits of the supreme and all-sufficient sacrifice.  
For over twenty years he was an active member of the Loyal Orange Association and was a past master of King William Lodge, Kingston and also held the office of Worshipful Master in St. George's L. O. L. No. 1171 and Boyne L. O. L. No. 614 in this city. For two years he faithfully performed the duties of county master for Queen's County and served one term as Deputy Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of P. E. Island and held various other offices in the Orange and Scarlet and was a charter member of Royal Black Preceptory No. 905. He also did efficient work as secretary of the Board of Trustees of the P. E. Island days of that institution. The funeral took place on Dec. 24th to the People's Cemetery and was very largely attended by the brethren of the Orange Association and other friends from town and country. The service at the house was conducted by the Rev. Daniel MacLean and at the grave by the officers of Royal Black Preceptory No. 905.
