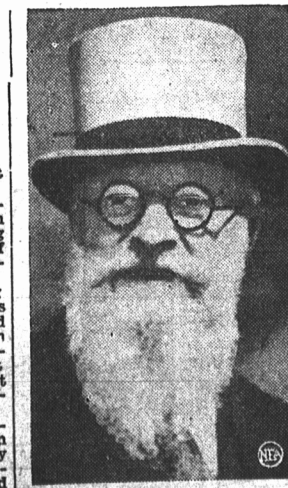
DENMARK'S VETERAN PREMIER FACES HIS GREATEST PROBLEM KNOWS NAZIS HUNGRILY EYE HIS COUNTRY

LONDON—As Denmark's Theodor Stauning starts his eleventh year as Premier, he and King Christian X can see the shadow of the Nazi Swastika creeping toward their peace-loving country.

Premier Stauning and King Christian know full well as does Adolf Hitler, that Denmark would furnish an ideal place from which German bombers could hop off toward Great Britain and that Danish harbours would be excellent lurking places for Nazi submarines and commerce raiders.

Today Germany holds the former Danish area of Holstein and southern Schleswig, seized by Prussia in 1864. Northern Schleswig, after the World War, voted to return to Denmark. And Premier Stauning and King Christian know that the Nazis would like it back—and perhaps more of Denmark, too.

that by the time he was 23, he had been elected Chairman of the Danish Union of Cigar Workers.

He entered the ranks of the Social Democratic Party. When he was 40 he was honored by election to the City Council of Copenhagen. Six years later, he became Chairman of that Council. A year later he became a Social Democratic Minister of State. His kindly, benevolent, bearded, respected face became one of the best known in the little kingdom.

In April, 1929, under his leadership, the Social Democrats became the leading party of the state. Stauning became Premier at the head of a coalition of Social Democrats and Radicals. He has been Premier ever since.

DANES NOT ARMING

Despite the present precarious position of Denmark, Premier Stauning has not spent a lot of money on armaments. In fact Denmark comes pretty close to being a completely disarmed nation. Stauning has no plans now for a feverish attempt to rearm. His country could not afford it. In area it would be like Massachusetts, Connecticut and Delaware attempting to fight Germany. In population, it would be like Chicago trying to do so.

All Stauning can do is to seek to preserve the neutrality of his little land, to hope that Hitler will leave it alone and also to hope that if he does not, France and England will come to its rescue.

"Fish 10 feet long, big as an elephant, chased me," the chief reported. "It was a long, grey beast and breathed fire."
"It was right at the back wheels of my wagon. You bet, I hurry," he added.
Later, when shown a picture, the chief agreed the "big fish" looked more like a hippopotamus than an elephant.

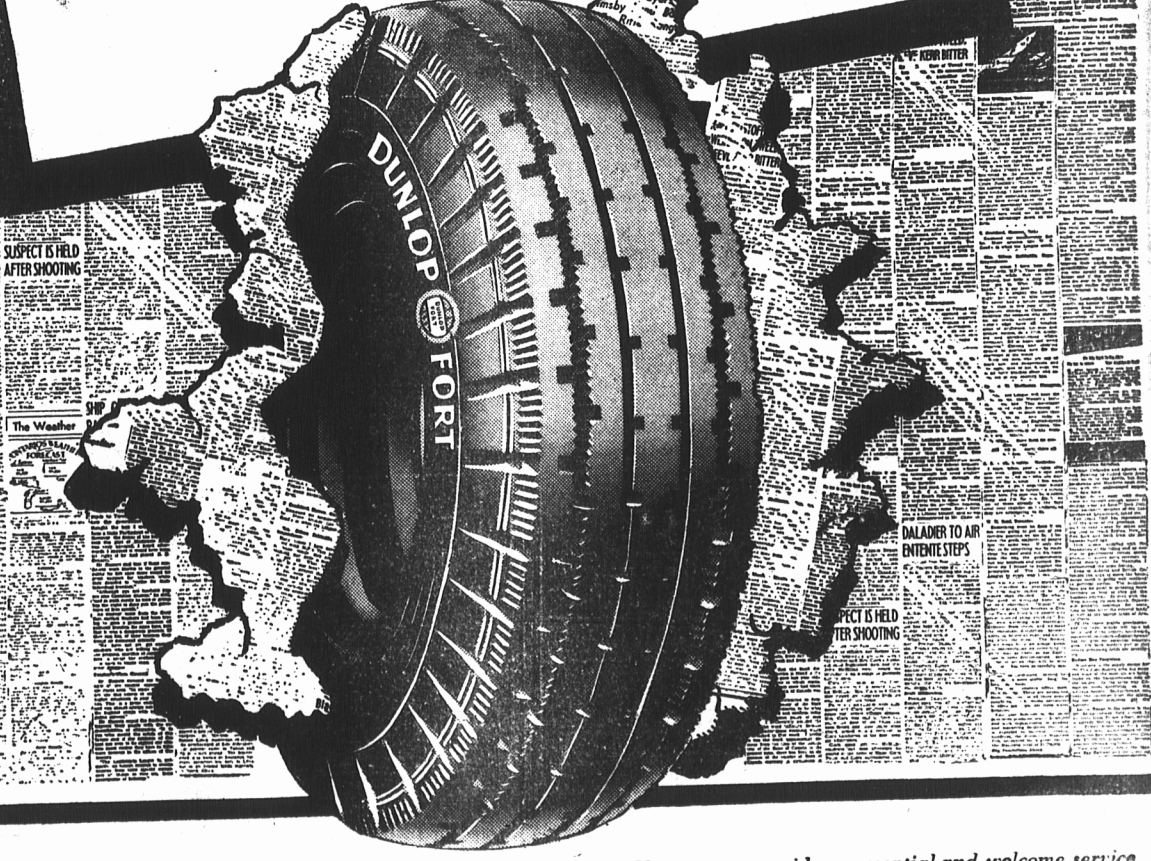
