"OBEY" IN THE MARRIAGE SERVICE.

Canadian women are, or should be, following with interest the war that is being waged in the Motherland for the little word "obey" in the marriage service. In this connection, a letter of the Rev. Mr. Chapman, the clergyman who married the man and woman who objected vigorously to the retention of the word in the service, is of the utmost interest and suggests lines of investigation not often thought of by the woman who is comfortably married.

"In the first place," writes Mr. Chapman to the Pall Mall Gazette, "it is wholly wrong to think of the women (amongst those who object to the word 'obey') as in the least less piously inclined than others, or as inspired with the smallest intention of disparaging the man whom they have elected to marry. Their strong feeling, so far as I would venture to be their spokesman, is that where the word 'love' is used, the word 'obey' is both superfluous and hurtful. It is noteworthy that this promise of love on which the whole service practically pivots, is made by both persons concerned, so that they have already compromised themselves to mutual obedience within the limits of self-respect and of that perfect freedom which characterises the service of true devotion. The inference that woman, by the use of this word, is constituted man's slave or chattel, and that the Church sanctifies such a bargain, cannot hold for an instant among spiritual people who are also possessed of mentality, and of a dignity which it is their bounden duty to maintain.

"The desire for the omission of the word 'obey,' however, is based on far larger and more serious grounds than obtain amongst educated people, in whose case, as I have tried to show, it is both unnecessary and unreasonable. In the poorer classes, I regret to say, after thirty years' experience in the altars, it is constantly the cause of gross and deplorable tyranny. Times without number, in trying to bring about peace between husband and wife, the former has argued that the latter swore at the altar to obey him, as though this conferred on him the right to treat her as he liked, to knock her about, and generally to play the bully, a tendency inherent in us all, and requiring no fulcrum of a false authority conferred on us by a priest.
