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THE COOK'S CORNER

STEAK AND KIDNEY PIE

- 2 pounds veal kidneys 1 pound round steak 4 tablespoons butter 1 cup mushrooms 2 cups water 4 tablespoons flour 1-4 cup water 1 tablespoon spiced meat sauce 4 small potatoes 12 small onions 1-1-2 teaspoon salt 1-4 teaspoon pepper

Method: Wipe the kidneys with a damp cloth and then soak in slightly salted water for about an hour. Drain and then cover with water and parboil until tender at a simmering temperature.

Now cut both the round steak and the parboiled kidneys into about 1-inch cubes. Melt the butter and brown both meats well in this. Add the mushrooms which have been peeled and sliced and the cups water and let come to a boil. Combine the 1-4 cup water and the spiced meat sauce and gradually add to the flour, blending to a smooth paste.

Add this to the meat mixture gradually and cook, stirring constantly, until the mixture thickens. Now add the potatoes and onions which have been cooked separately in salted water until tender. Season with salt and pepper and place the mixture in a buttered casserole. Cover with a rich pastry crust and bake in a moderately hot oven (400 deg. F.) for about 30 minutes.

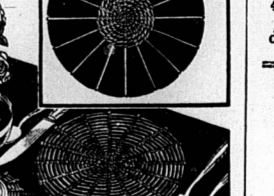
FLUFFY MASHED TURNIPS

- 2 tablespoons shortening 4 cups mashed turnips 1-2 teaspoon salt 1-1-2 tablespoons sugar 1-8 tea-spoon pepper 1-8 tea-spoon paprika 2 egg yolks 2 egg whites

Method: Melt the shortening and then add the turnips, salt, sugar, pepper and paprika. Beat the egg yolks until thick and lemon-colored and fold these into the turnip mixture, then fold in the egg whites that have been stiffly beaten. Place in a greased baking dish and bake in a moderately hot oven (400 deg. F.) for about 20 minutes—it can be baked in the same oven with the meat pie. Place this in the oven just 20 minutes before you wish to serve it for it is best served as soon and wrapped as soon as it comes from the oven.

Fine Spider-Web Doilies You Can Quickly Weave



Your Loom a Cardboard Circle What a welcome gift a set of these dainty spider-web doilies would be! Or imagine how pretty they'd look on your own table.

You can quickly weave a set using crocheted cotton and home-made "looms," just circles you cut from heavy cardboard.

Around the edge of the loom for the larger doilies cut 16 even spaced notches. Paste an end of the thread to centre, then wind thread across loom, around through 2 adjacent notches and back across loom through two opposite notches.

Continue in this way until thread is wound through every notch. Now you've set up your warp and are ready to weave. Bring cotton to centre, thread through a needle and start weaving in a circle. Work toward edge, passing the needle under each warp thread, then making a loop around it as in diagram.

In a jiffy you finish your delicate "web" and, of course, the small doilies are no trick. Cut only 8 notches on their little looms.
