(C.P. By Guardian's Special Wire) MONTREAL, Feb. 17 — Prices turned slowly upward on the stock market and advances ranging up to more than a point showed at the close.

Steel of Canada showed strength at 2, up 1-2, while the preferred stock at 90, up 3-4. Foundry gained a fraction and Cement was unchanged. Rails were firm except for a loss of 1-8 for Canadian Pacific at 67-8.

In utilities Brazilian turned down narrow, but fractional advances appeared for Montreal Power, Canada Northern Power, Gattineau preferred and Shawinigan. Off fractions were General Steel Wares, both common and rights, and Lake of the Woods, Dominion Steel and Coal "B" and Imperial Oil advanced narrow.

(By Frederick Gardner) NEW YORK, Feb. 17 — Stocks turned the tables on gloom forces in today's market and rallied fractions to 3 or more points.

Transfers amounted to 856,780 shares compared with 472,060 yesterday. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks was up 1.1 points at 44.7.

Canadian stocks tended higher. Bell Telephone, up 4 7-8 points to 165, led the up trend followed by 1 3-8 points gain to 50 in International Nickel. Distillers-Searnam, Walkers and Imperial Oil improved fractions. Dome dropped 2 points to 58 and Lake Shore a point to 56 3-4 as McIntyre eased slightly.

WINNIPEG, Feb. 17 —(CP)—Wheat futures, for the second successive day, rallied from early losses inspired by rains or snow in the United States southwest winter wheat belt to close higher on Winnipeg grain exchange today.

Inflation talk in the United States led to fair general buying to place values 1 3-4-3-4 cent higher at the close.

When nervousness developed at Chicago over Washington officials' conference about proposed hoisting of commodity price levels, wheat shot up about two cents there and encouraged short-covering at Winnipeg.

Liverpool rallied with North American markets and closed 3-4-1-1-8 higher after erratic trading.

Buenos Aires was unchanged near the close. Chicago closed 1-1-3-8 cents higher.

Excessive Taxes Discourage Tourists

Tourists in Canada and United States spent well over a billion dollars in 1937 for gasoline, oil, repairs, and garaging.

This forecast is based on figures supplied by the Automobile Association. The American Automobile Association for instance, estimates that \$850,000,000 was spent in these commodities in 1936 and reports are that the "crop" of tourists this year is exceeding that of 1936 by 10 to 30 percent.

In some States the tourist dollar is sought after that it has become the largest single source of revenue. The future course of touring depends quite naturally on the extent to which the tourist is given those things requisite to his enjoyment, and free from unduly severe restrictions.

Excessive taxes on poor roads, restrictions at state borders, lack of parking facilities, and poor route marking, are the principal deterrents to growth of motor travel. It will continue to grow so long as everything possible is done to assure movement of the motor car with greatest economy.
