AN accident occurred at Reddin Bros. drug store last evening, which although not resulting more seriously than with the loss of a valuable coat, might have ended with loss to property and probably to life. William Payne, the popular druggist with the firm, had procured from another store some powder for tableaux which were to be given at the Convent shortly. Leaving it in his valuable fur lined coat pocket which was hanging on the wall, he went about his duties when suddenly an explosion startled the occupants of the store. Spontaneous combustion had occurred and the powder, which is very easily ignited, had gone up in smoke. The valuable coat was also ablaze and before the fire had been extinguished it was almost totally destroyed. The danger was aggravated by the proximity of many drugs in the store which were easily ignited and very combustible. Had the accident taken place in the absence of the occupants of the store a serious conflagration would doubtless have occurred.

THE Captain and crew of the schooner Evoluton walked ashore from Governors Island and came to the city yesterday. They report the schooner ashore about 1/2 of a mile from the Island. She is aground at low tide but floats at high water. She was driven to her present position by the ice which snapped the chains of both anchors. The ice is piled all round the vessel and it is hardly possible she can be released until the spring. When the Coban passed the schooner on Wednesday evening, the latter had signals flying asking to be towed back to Charlottetown. The captain interviewed Captain Finlayson with a view of having the Minto tow the schooner out but as there is not sufficient water for the strainer it is impossible to render aid.

THE second quarterly meeting of the Margate Circuit, Methodist, was held in Kensington on Wednesday, Dec. 3rd. A goodly number was present and all the interests of the church were found to be in the usual flourishing condition. All the stewards were re-appointed for the ensuing year, with Samuel Glydon, Esq., Recording Steward. David Rogers, Esq., gave notice that at the next regular meeting of the Board he would move that the time has arrived for the erection of a parsonage. The present parsonage is between forty and forty-five years old, and is, therefore, in the matter of comfort and convenience, not in keeping with the beautiful and comfortable churches on the circuit nor of the general progress of the times. As the Methodist people in this section of the country are generally prosperous and progressive and always alive to the cause of the Master, and to the comfort and convenience of their minister, it is hoped they will take hold of the matter and that in the near future the pressing need of the circuit in this regard will be met.
