The latest news, first of all.

Thirteen years ago on December 14th the plebiscite was taken in this province with reference to the prohibitory law. It will be remembered that Prince Edward Island supported the prohibition of the liquor traffic by an overwhelming majority.

Some time ago The Guardian announced that it had devoted three prizes for the best ten varieties of commercial apples to be exhibited at the recent Fruit Show in the Kindergarten Hall in this city. These prizes have been awarded as follows: One was a years subscription to The Morning Guardian—won by A.E. Dewar, City. Six Months subscription to The Morning Guardian—won by J.A. Annear, Montague. Three months subscription to The Morning Guardian—won by A. M. McInnes, Pownal. In the letter informing this paper of the placing of the awards the writer says "I am sorry that the first prize was won by a man who is already one of your subscribers but he does not seem inclined to swap it off for another paper, as he would prefer to have it to any of the others."

The Guardian has received from Hyndman & Co, City, a beautiful calendar. The Shipping Illustrated of New York, speaking of the calendar says: "Editorial remarks in Shipping Illustrated have suggested a great many things in the way of business to enterprising readers from time to time, but credit has not been given until now for the inspiration of an original calendar. Writing from Charlottetown, P. E. I., under date of Nov. 3, however, Messrs Hyndman & Co., Lloyd agents at that port, state that their 1910 calendar was suggested by the reading of a recent article in this paper. The calendar bears in red ink this quotation from the article: "Many a well built ship has come to an untimely end, and many a valuable life has been sacrificed owing to neglect on the part of the master to have a cast off the lead." The calendar shows a fine colored reproduction of a painting of a barquentine at sea, with a sea-sprite, having evidently got into a dangerous position from neglect of the lead. Messrs Hyndman and Co rightly think that "every sea captain should have these lines hung up in his cabin or chart room within easy sight."

It is commendable to note the good work being done by the Salvation Army in this City in connection with their efforts to make the Christmas season a happy one alike to the rich and poor. Circular letters are being sent to many of the prosperous citizens of this City, together with a slip giving a list of objects which especially deserve sympathy and help at this time. Will all those who receive these letters, and who purpose giving, kindly forward their donation at their earliest convenience, so the work of the ones who have this scheme in hand may be very much lightened. Renfrew made an offer some days ago and All Montreal went them some better. Then Renfrew made him a final offer of at ten o'clock yesterday morning of a thousand dollars. He has given his word to Renfrew however, and that is where he will play. He left for home on the Maritime express of the Intercolonial at noon to prepare for the winter's stay in this part of the country.

Prof Adam Shortt of Ottawa, head of the department for the examination of candidates for the Civil Service, reached Quebec yesterday in the course of his tour, and will shortly be in Ottawa again. While in the Maritime Province Prof. Shortt raised the number of points at which examinations may be held to seven. He also appointed, or confirmed in their appointments, examiners in each place. The examination points now are:—Fredericton, Halifax, St. John, Yarmouth, Moncton, Charlottetown, and Sydney. In the latter place an examiner has not yet been decided upon. In Fredericton the work will be done by the U. N. B., in Halifax by Dalhousie College, in Charlottetown by Prince of Wales College, in St. John by G. U. Hay, in Yarmouth by Principal Kempton of the Yarmouth Academy, and in Moncton by Principal Oulton of the High School. Prof. Shortt said that he had expended some time in explaining the methods called for by the new law, but had found things running smoothly in general.—St. John Sun.
