FISH PLENTIFUL. Montague is being plentifully supplied with fresh herring and codfish and from the almost full boat loads that are daily arriving the fish must be very plentiful. The life of the fisherman is not always the pleasantest, he is out in all kinds of weather, and on many occasions has to brave the elements, and should be made a hero occasionally it is only what he justly deserves.

PRODUCE LADEN. The Schr. Etta Vaughan, Capt. Murray, sailed from the port of Montague on Tuesday last for Cape Breton ports. The cargo of this vessel comprises about three thousand bushels of potatoes and two thousand bushels of oats, and was shipped by the firm of McLeod & McGregor. Part of this cargo is white potatoes and will be used for seeding purposes.

DEPARTURE REGRETTED. Montague's two young lady visitors, Miss Emma Sparks, and Miss Violet McLeod, left on Wednesday last on their return to St. John's to resume the splendid positions which both of them hold. MONTAGUE SHIPPING. Shipping is now at a standstill in Montague. The farmers being all busy on the land, and no produce of any kind is moving. The schr. Argo, Capt. Murphy is the only vessel in port, and owing to the dullness in the freighting business is laid up. The steamer Dominion Fish-er arrived in Montague last week from the Madagascars bound to Halifax and will continue running to this port every fortnight. His many friends were glad to see Capt. Murphy back again and looking his usual cheerful self. The Fisher is a large boat and looked up quite conspicuous in the harbor. The little gasoline schr. Muriel, Capt. White is again on the route between Montague and Pictou, making weekly trips, a very affording direct passenger accommodation to the mainland.
