



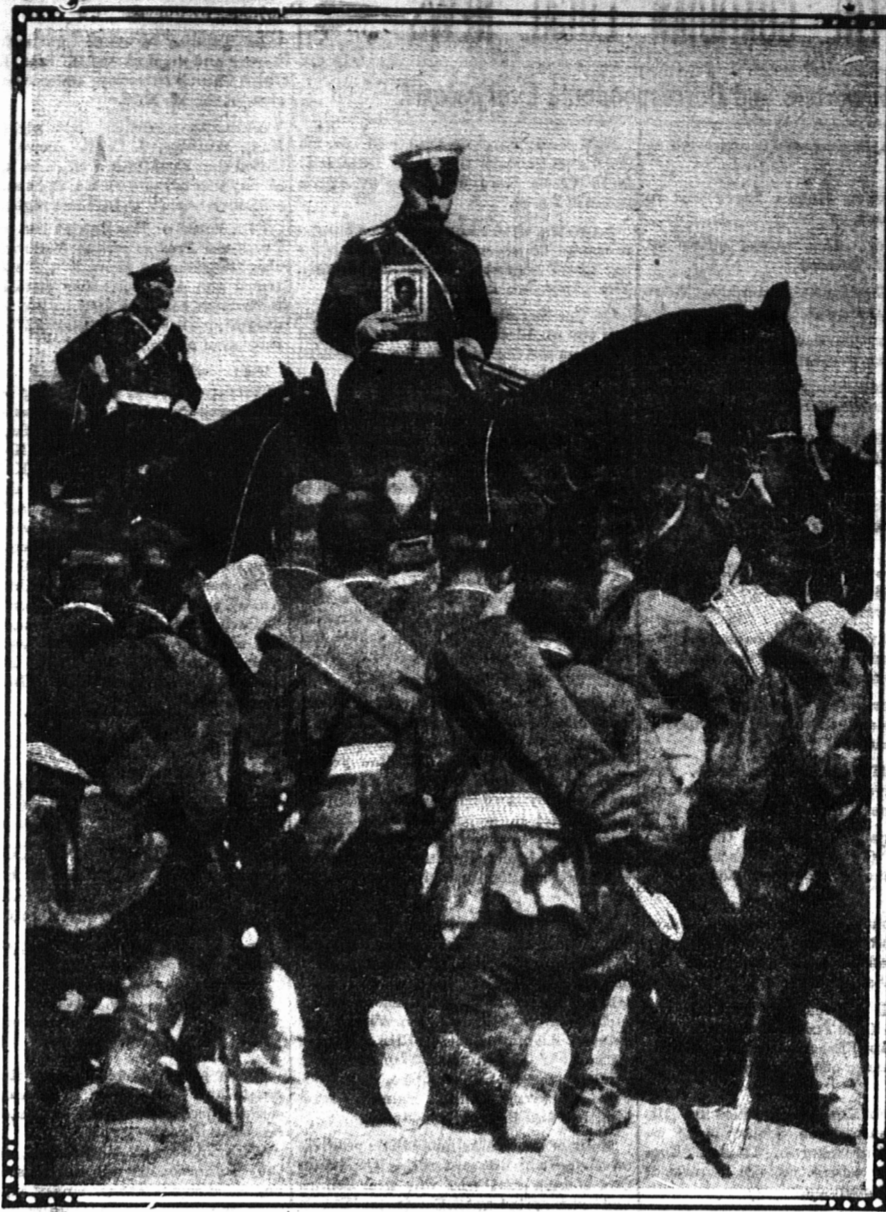

Mayor Compton, Councillors Ryan, McKinnon and Dobson were sworn in to office yesterday.

It is reported that in the western section of Prince County a farmer a few days ago shot one of his horses, a nice three year old, on account of the scarcity of fodder.

The death occurred at Kildare last week of John O'Brien, aged 70. His son Patrick O'Brien is seriously ill with pneumonia, and prospects for his recovery are not very bright.

On the night of the recent Bedeque by-election about one hundred friends of Hon. S. E. Reid gathered at his home in Trion to offer their congratulations and best wishes on his election. A number of speeches were made, and a very pleasant evening was spent.

It is said that in the canvass during the civic election campaign some candidates were appealing most to those in favor of and against water works and sewerage in a way that would satisfy the voter no matter what were his views on the question and that they would if elected be governed by the wish of the people. This was fair enough, for properly speaking the question was not an issue in the election. But as a sample of the way in which the friends of some of the candidates worked to secure votes, a report comes from the west end that some women were moved to tears because they had been told that if water works were established the taxes would be so high that they would have to leave town.

A social was held in Labor Union Hall last evening under the auspices of the Summerside convent.

No foreign mail was received in Summerside yesterday. Mails were received by team from Charlottetown via Cape Traverse; St. Eleanors, Bedeque and Western-Prince County. Outward mails were despatched by teams for all the above places and the Mainland.

At the recent opening of the Alberton station Mr. Montgomery, Station Agent in reply to the address tendered him expressed his warmest thanks and sincere gratitude to the people for their flattering address and valuable presentation to him. He felt happy and gratified indeed, to know that his feeble efforts had gained in so large a measure the esteem and confidence which, he thought, he so little deserved. In the year 1885, Mr. Montgomery stated that he came to Alberton and for the following ten years was connected with the best interests of the town. In speaking of the introducing of the Railway Bill, he referred to the late Ex-Governor Howland and Stanislaus Perry as faithful advocates of the P. E. I. Railway, and the Railway Bill was passed on Oct. 2nd 1892. In the fall of 1897 the Railway was finished but, on account of approaching winter, the road was not opened until the following spring. In May 1875 Mr. Montgomery stated that he was appointed station master of Alberton. Although feeling not confident he endeavored at all times to carry out the duties of his office with impartiality and he felt confident from the flattering address just read that these efforts were rewarded. He referred to several public men who had passed away since he had entered upon the duties of his office here, 30 years ago, which time is almost the allotted span of a generation. He said that in discharging the duties devolved upon him, he endeavored, at all times to give satisfaction, and always acted impartially. If he had failed to do this and had spoken the harsh word at any time, or had done anything detrimental to the interests of Alberton, Mr. Montgomery said that such was not the heart and he apologized most sincerely for any such real or imaginary weakness. In concluding, he again thanked the citizens for their kind address, for their estimable gift and wished one and all every happiness and blessing of this life and of the life to come.
