—DROWNED.—A deplorable drowning accident occurred at Montrose last Tuesday evening when Joseph McMillan, son of Mr. Daniel McMillan of Birch Grove, lost his life in the Montrose River. It seems, so far as we can ascertain, that the deceased, together with three or four younger ones, went in to bathe and swim in the river. The water at the place of the accident is rather hot and the shore makes sudden drops to deep water. After swimming about for a short time the deceased cried out "I am drowning," and sank from sight. His companions, none of whom could swim, ran for help but this came too late. The victim of the untoward accident was only nineteen years of age, industrious and hard working, and his sudden removal from life in his early youth has produced a shock such as seldom descends upon a community. Immediate search was made for the body which was recovered late the night of the fatality. The sympathy of all goes out to the bereaved father, sisters and brothers in their time of sorrow.

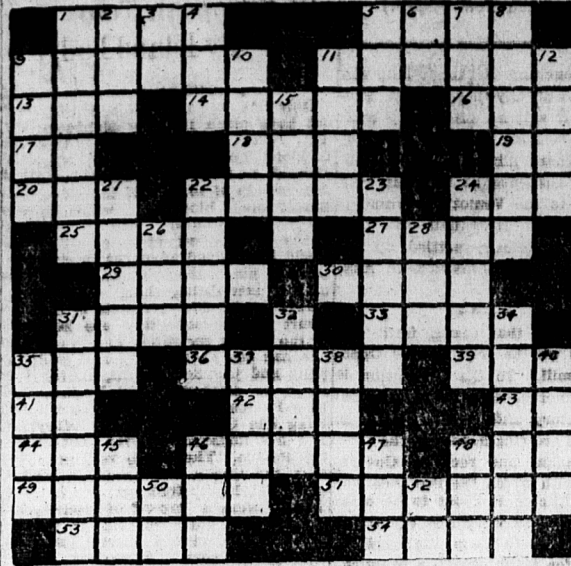

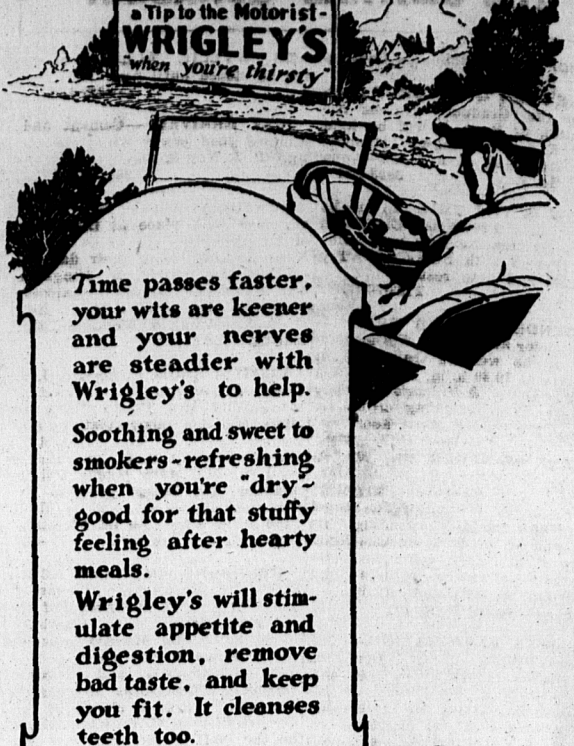
