Negro Made a Vicious Attack TRURO, Aug. 3.—A serious assault, following an attempt at robbery, occurred this morning at Folly Lake. Ivan Slack and his son Euler, keep a general store and meat shop there. When the older man came to open the shop a colored man attacked him, poss-

ibly believing he had brought down from the house the cash used in the business. Euler arrived while the attack was being made and took part. The negro used a large meat hook and struck at both men cutting the elder man badly about the face, and bruising him in other places. The young man also suffered from several blows.

The negro then was driven off, and after an alarm was raised creating a posse of about twenty-five who searched the neighborhood in the Valley, they succeeded in capturing him.
