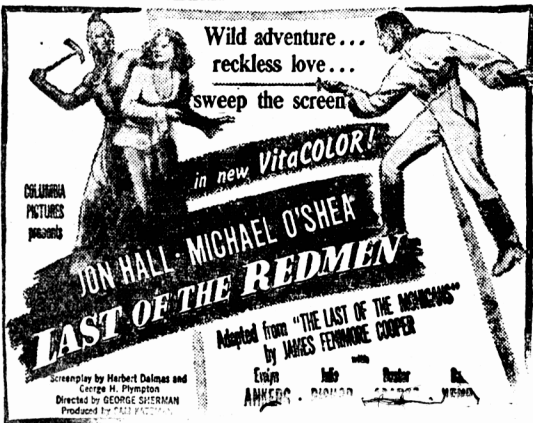

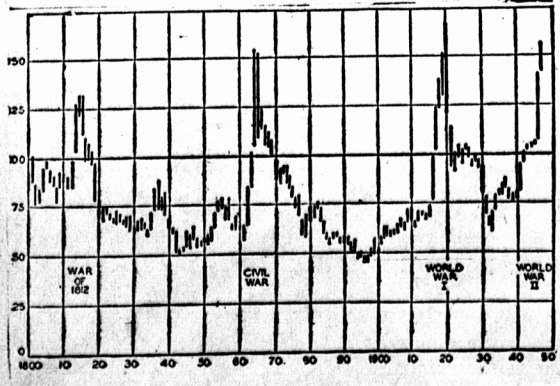

Happy Immigrants Land At Halifax

HALIFAX, Jan 12 - Their hearts filled with new faith and hope that they may now be able to live a normal, happy and peaceful life, 959 immigrants from Europe are on their way from this port tonight on three Canadian National Railway boat specials to various sections of Canada to make a fresh start in life.

Happy smiles reflect this new lease on life that has been given to them and light up their faces now that they are at last in a land of freedom and plenty. But they do not hide the troubled lines that mark the faces of the grown ups who have suffered for years from oppression, worry and under-nourishment.

Among nearly 1,200 passengers to arrive here this morning on the Cunard Donaldson liner "Aquitania", the new Canadians include 38 persons for the Maritime Provinces. Of the others, 88 are going to Quebec points; 564 to Ontario; 304 to western Canada; 22 to Newfoundland and 22 to the United States. In addition there are 102 British and Canadian servicemen going to various sections of Canada.

The youngest passenger on the CNR train is Olga Anna Hrycaj, who since she was born in Amsterdam a week ago tonight, has travelled by rail, air, sea, and road. Olga was born while her mother and father, the former Ukrainian farmer, were on their way to England with 200 other displaced persons to sail on the "Aquitania". The tiny infant was two and a half hours old when she and her mother were taken to the airport in an ambulance and flown to London. The Hrycaj's also have a son, Bohdan, five. They are going to Montreal to live with relatives.

There are nearly 250 other children travelling on the boat specials, one of the largest groups since the large scale movement of soldiers dependents ended. The immigrants include 210 dependents of workers flown to Ontario by the provincial government, 200 displaced persons, 50 Dutch farmers, 23 Jewish orphans coming to Canada for adoption and 100 other unclassified Europeans. There are also 40 brides of Canadian servicemen.

Sensational Discovery In Hormone Crystals

NEW HAVEN, Jan. 11 (AP) - At the Yale University School of Medicine Dr. Alfred Wilhelm held up a little vial of liquid which gleamed with a silken sheen as he swirled it in the light.

The silky sheen came from crystals, suspended in the water, that powerfully stimulate growth. They are veritable giant-makers.

In 10 days, rats will gain body weight equal to 100,000 the weight of the crystals they receive. A full-grown rat in a few weeks will double its weight on a tiny amount. The weight gain is not fat and tissues.

Nothing would happen if you drank the liquid for the crystals are protein and would be destroyed by stomach juices. But it makes animals, and possibly humans, grow rapidly when injected into their bloodstreams.

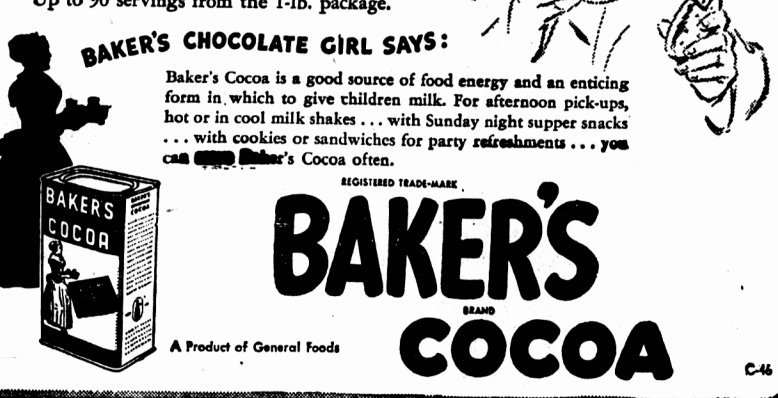
