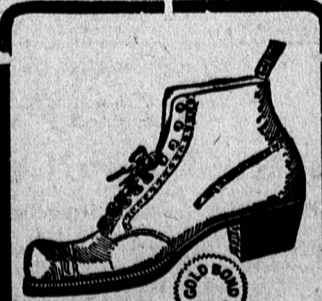
IN MEMORIAM

MR. HUBERT A. VESSEY.

It is with the deepest regret The Guardian chronicles the death of Hubert A. Vessey in the thirtieth year of his age, deceased was a honest, industrious, hard-working young man, always ready to lend a helping hand to them, who needed his assistance. On April the 16th when, sawing wood for a neighbor, he complained of not feeling well, and returned to his home early in the afternoon. About two o'clock in the morning he grew worse. Dr. Marchison was immediately called in, but all that medical skill, and loving hands, could do, could not banish that dread disease, pneumonia, and on the twenty-second, his spirit peacefully passed away to its eternal reward, there to await his Saviour's all. Besides a large circle of friends and relatives, he leaves to mourn, a heart broken father and one sister Katie. Although the roads were almost impassible, his remains were followed to their last resting place in Bonshaw by about 90 sleighs. The funeral service was conducted by Rev. Mr. Hattie of the Presbyterian church. The pall bearers were Mr. Russell Boyce, Eddy Boyce, Charles McLaughy, Bradford Boyce, Neil Salmon and Donald McFayden.

THE LATE MR. JOHN C. MCCARTHY

The residents of Tignish and vicinity were shocked on Tuesday last to hear of the death of Mr. John C. McCarthy, Sea Cow Pond. The circumstances connected with the death are particularly sad but somewhat different from what was first reported. Mr. McCarthy left Tignish on Monday night for Sea Cow Pond about six miles distant. It is thought that when but a short way from home the horse became frightened and bolted throwing the deceased to the ground overturning the wagon upon Mr. McCarthy. When picked up the unfortunate man was still breathing but expired shortly afterwards. His neck had been broken. The late Mr. McCarthy was one of the most highly respected men connected with the lobster business being one of the leading packers. He had attained his 75th year and leaves to bewail his loss, besides a host of friends his sorrowing widow and a large family—four daughters and five sons. The daughters are—Miss Beatrice, teacher at Kelly's Cross. Sister St. Mary, Notre Dame Academy, Charlottetown; Sister St. Alcega, Montreal and Sister St. Gerald, Providence, P. I. The sons are—Chester, Law Student, Charlottetown
