Plans and specifications may be seen and full information obtained at the office of Mr. Gordon, Chief Engineer, Ottawa, Ont., and Mr. A. B. Doucet, District Engineer, Quebec, P. Q. Persons intending to tender will not be considered unless made on the printed forms supplied by the Commissioners. Each tender must be signed and sealed by all the parties to the tender, and witnessed, and be accompanied by an accepted cheque on a chartered Bank of the Dominion of Canada, payable to the order of the Commissioners of the Transcontinental Railway, for the sum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000).
