### A CHANCE ESCAPE.

NEW YORK, March 27—Moidita Tratsinsky, a Russian novelist and poet of repute, has escaped from Siberia, where he was imprisoned five years ago. During the persecution of Hebrews at the time when the Russian massacres were at its height, Tratsinsky openly denounced the Russian government in fiery language, and published pamphlets accusing Russia of being the most barbaric, despotic and unenlightened country on the globe. These attacks engaged the attention of the police, and the insinuations were directed against, as they were the chief cause in instigating the "moujik" to outrageous acts of cruelty against the Hebrews. They consequently arrested Tratsinsky, and without a trial he was sentenced to life imprisonment in Siberia. His escape was enacted through the aid of one of his friends in New York. About a year ago, he wrote to his friend, giving a full description of his appearance, and asking for a passport to be forwarded to him, pasted in a magazine so as to elude the post offices, and have it sent to him as literature. This was accordingly done, and safely reached the hands of the prisoner, who, awaiting his opportunity one day, managed to escape.

### ETONIANS LIKE THEIR TOP HATS.

LONDON, March 26—Eton boys are deeply distressed at the threatened decay of the top hat. The Eton boy in a bowler or even an aigrette plumed Hamburg would be a fearful anomaly. "It cannot be realized how much the success of Etonians in public life is due to the top hat, which long practice enables him to wear with sangfroid impossible to men not broken to it in extreme youth. Thus the Eton College Chronicle is defence of the old fashioned topper. It points out that despite the animosity it excites, the top hat is the only form of hat for which there is a pet name, "Topper" is a word unparalleled in the English language; it is the only nickname which has firmly ingrained itself in the popular speech. "The top hat," the Eton College Chronicle observes, will soon attain its centenary. It has had many vicissitudes; it has had a curly and a flat brim; it has varied in shapes from that of a stove pipe to something like a wasp waist, but it has been the same hat in essentials all the time.

So let the city man, the society man of Mayfair and Belgrave and the "nut" of Bond Street abandon the topper if he will; the Eton boy will preserve it from oblivion, just as the blue coat boys of Christ Church wear no hats at all.

### SUFFERINGS IN INDIA BROVE WOMAN INSANE.

NEW YORK, March 27—Walter H. Thompson of Chicago met his fiancée, Miss Margaret Reynolds, at the pier when the steamer Verona docked to welcome her home from India, where she had been a missionary. But instead of the girl who left him two years ago found a gray haired woman of 24, bereft of reason, who failed to recognize him. Miss Reynolds had been in the famine stricken regions of India. The suffering she saw there drove her insane and a nurse had to bring her back. Mr. Thompson and the nurse are taking her home to Waterloo, Iowa.

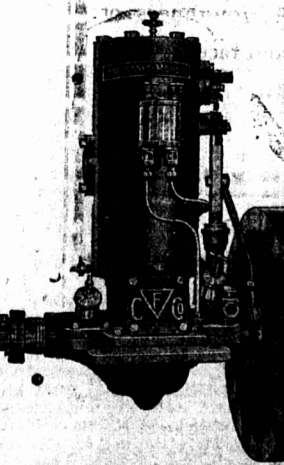
