CANADA AND THE CARNEGIE HERO FUND.

It was in 1904 that Andrew Carnegie's claims put forward for them upon the sum of five million dollars to establish the Hero Fund. A committee consisting of twenty-one persons having this was perhaps to have been a perpetual succession was entrusted with the management and control of the fund. Mr. Carnegie's donation for an award is made or a claim was in a per cent. steel bolts, yield-rejected.

Three out of the eight medals made for heroism from medals which came to Canada were April, 1904, to January 31, 1910, awarded here, and each of the three medals, 175 bronze medals, and pecuniary awards. This Prince Edward Island received any awards to heroes and their three-eighths of the medals and pendants of \$248,000. This includes three-fourths of the money awarded amounts paid on pension allowances from the Carnegie Hero Fund in Canada. Contributions have also been made. The beneficiaries in this Province from the fund in aid of sufferers by violence were Miss Rattenbury, silver deaster, to the amount of \$134,462, medal and \$2,000; John A. Grady. The Commission has also in all bronze medal and \$500, and Duncan 1921 claims to consider, of which J. Campbell, bronze medal and \$500, 336 were granted, 3,494 refused and 791 are still pending. It will be seen that the number who have made claims for themselves or have had awards were made.

A PERORATION AT THE HAGUE.

The sittings of The Hague Tribunal have of late been occupied with the address of counsel in the famous Newfoundland-United States Fisheries case, in which Canada and the Mother Country are interested. The importance of the case naturally led the learned counsel for the opposed parties to address the Tribunal at length. Counsel George Turner, on the part of the United States spoke for eight days, his peroration was itself almost a nine days wonder, and no doubt it impressed the international big was profoundly. It may be questioned whether ever before such a restless eloquence had followed over The Hague. After a reference to the ties of blood between Britain and the United States the orator "perored" as follows:

"Notwithstanding this, they frequently have their differences, and differences accumulated and aggravated by this kindred blood to which I have referred, and it is that the British Lion rouses himself, and with tense muscles and bristling mane looks towards the west, and roars his anger at those whom he remembers as his whelps across the sea; and it is then that the whelps across the sea, no longer whelps but full-grown lions, on hearing the challenge, raise their heads no wirt intimidated, and respond to it with answering roar, which shakes the very waters and proves them worthy of the blood from which they sprang. And then happily the disturbance generally subsides, and peace reigns again over the great deeps."

UNDERVALUATION.

It is not only in Prince Edward Island that land owners left to value their lands for purposes of taxation have fixed the values too low. But we learn that the adjusters, in their present arduous investigation, are finding many cases of this kind, and, of course and so far as may be done without shocking the owners' sensibilities too much, we presume they will put these matters right.

Chancellor Lloyd George recently gave the House of Commons some instances of how undervaluation is attempted in England. In one case an estate was valued by the executor for death duties at £1135, but when the matter was officially investigated he consented to a valuation of £8,500, more than seven times the first figure; in another case the value of an estate had been returned at £209,000, but later a valuation of £280,000 was agreed to. In still another case where an estate had been represented as worth no more than £74,000—the representatives, of the property agreed that it was worth £175,000. It is as well to have the owner's estimate of the value of land officially corrected sometimes. Death and taxes are among the sure things, and in both cases the many are shy of them.

Cornfoot was a man of excellent attainments. He has been a clergyman serving pastorates in this city and at Nottingham. He was married and leaves a family.

Some twenty-five years ago he left the ministry to engage in business. Beginning in a small way as an outside broker he built up a big patronage and during the South African boom the turn-over of his brokerage house was larger than that of any similar firm in London.

But while he was outstripping his competitors in the street, domestic worries preyed on his mind. Last year his physicians ordered him to take a long sea voyage. He sought recuperation by absenting himself from his offices and in the meantime his business was allowed to drift until today his affairs reached the bankruptcy court.
