LIVESTOCK MARKETS

(Canadian Press) MONTREAL, June 16.—Cattle receipts on the two Montreal livestock markets today totalled 800. Indications were that cattle would not be cleaned up today.

Calf receipts, 3376. The calf market was slow and lower. About 700 calves were sold early today with the prices ranging from \$4.00 to \$9.00. The bulk of the calves were common veal and drinkers. Fair to medium good veal made \$7.00 to \$7.50.

Sheep receipts 798. Sheep were easier at \$2.50 for culls to \$6.00 for the best lots. Spring lambs were \$1.00 to \$2.00 lower. Good lambs brought \$14.00 to \$15.00. Medium kinds around \$13.00. Common light lambs \$11.50 to \$12.00 and were not wanted.

Quotations—Ewes \$2.50 to \$6.00; lambs, good \$14.00 to \$15.00, common \$11.50 to \$13.50. Hog receipts, 1424. Hogs were easier, sales were made at \$12.50 to \$12.75 for bacon and butchers with \$1.00 premium per hog on selects. Heavy hogs around \$12.00, light and feeders \$13.00 to \$13.50. Sows brought \$9.50 to \$10.50.
