Such were some of the momentous decisions and weighty matters with which our former government and Legislature were empowered to deal and which were shorn away and entrusted to the Parliament of Canada by the Union of 1873. Our Legislative Assembly was then a comparatively small body and should have 50 members, but we had then a Legislative Council of 12 members. The Peters Government instead of abolishing the Legislative Council, practically united it with the Assembly, the membership of which was proportionately increased to 30 as it has since remained.

Thus it came about that our Legislative Assembly, after being denuded of half its prerogatives and powers, including those of the highest importance, was increased in numbers by 66 per cent. And with this came the further anomaly of requiring one half the members of the new Assembly to be elected by a smaller number of electors, with a different qualification from the other half. No other province, which has abolished its Upper House, has increased the membership of its Lower House, and in no other Legislative Assembly have the members a different jurisdiction such as Councillors and Assemblymen.

FLEET OF RUN-RUNNERS OPERATING OUT OF ST. PIERRE AND NASSAU

SYDNEY, B. C., Sept 11.—According to information supplied the Evening Echo's correspondent, an international run running syndicate based on New York has a fleet of upwards of a hundred craft motor and sail, engaged in smuggling liquor from St. Pierre and the Bahamas to Canadian and American ports. The ships with their cargoes run to rendezvous outside the three mile limit where they cruise about and tranship their freight to high powered motor boats which in turn land the contraband at selected places along the shore between Key West and Quebec. St. Pierre, the little French island off the south coast of Newfoundland bids fair in a short while to become the wealthiest dependency of France.
