A. W. PERRY IN TANGLE.—There was a good hour of excitement near the Plant line wharf in Halifax on Sunday morning when the steamer A. W. Perry's anchor fouled the mud-hook of the tern schooner Advent, tied up at Bissett's wharf. It was only by the tightest squeeze that a disastrous collision was averted. The Perry was backing out of the pier beginning her run to Boston about nine o'clock, but swerved in too near Jones' wharf, and, as an added precaution to avoid danger, the anchor was thrown out while the engines were started full speed astern. But the steamer's anchor hooked onto the anchor of the docked schooner Advent, when it made bottom and with the A. W. Perry's propeller churning her sternward the Advent was drawn out into the harbor. Her three stern hawsers were snapped by the strain and two of the anchor piles were torn out of Bissett's wharf. The bow lines held, however, and prevented the Advent from colliding with the fish laden schooner Greenwood, which was berthed at Jones' wharf. Had this been the case one of the vessels would have been damaged to the point of foundering, said a member of the windjammer's crew. A good crowd for over an hour watched the A. W. Perry extricate herself from the tangle.

RUSHING WORK ON FERRY AND RAILWAY SERVICE.

The completion of the transcontinental railway through to the Atlantic Coast, and the institution of a ferry service the year round to Prince Edward Island, are the two engineering problems attracting most attention at present in the Maritime Provinces.

Roger Miller, who has the contract for erecting the ferry terminal at Carleton Point, while in Montreal a few days ago, stated that he was of the opinion that his work will consume two seasons, and that the Government should have little difficulty in maintaining an all-year service, once the boats are running.

Gordon Grant chief engineer of the Transcontinental Railway, was at Montreal the same time. Mr. Grant said that only ten miles of blasting needs to be accomplished before the lines are completed east of Quebec. He hopes to turn over his contract, finished, to the Grand Trunk Pacific next Spring.

THE ANNUAL CELEBRATION.

DUBLIN, Nov. 24.—The annual celebration in commemoration of the hanging of the Manchester Martyrs was held here on Sunday. Some twelve thousand people marched to Glasnevin cemetery. All was quiet except some stone throwing at the police by strikers.

Elsewhere in this issue will be found an advertisement of the P. E. Island Silver Fox Breeders Association. In the interests of the business it is desirable that all possible information be available. This will be a guide to buyers and will prevent not only fraud but the suspicion of it which unfortunately is already beginning to affect the industry. The confidence of the investors must be maintained and the only way in which this can be done is to place at their disposal an authoritative bureau of information. This the Association aims to be. Foxes and fox companies recognized by the Association will have the first claim upon the market, those not so recognized must take their chances. 2862.
