CASTRO ENGINEERS NEW SHOT OF MOVE

WASHINGTON, D. C., July 17.—That former President Castro of Venezuela is furnishing funds for the revolutionary movement in the neighboring republic of Columbia, is the latest rumor received in Washington from South America. Various rumors reported to the State Department allege that Castro wishes to make use of the revolutionary forces of Columbia as a means of re-installing himself in Venezuela. Information has been received at the department that Colombian troops have been dispatched to Honda, a town on the Magdalena river ostensibly to intercept any revolutionary forces ascending the river toward Bogota, the capital.

LONDON, July 17.—Roumania today with her 50,700 square miles and her population of 7,000,000, is a constitutional monarchy in the best sense of the term, with the rights and prerogatives of the Rumanian subjects guaranteed. "Agriculture has been the country is one of the chief grain-producing countries of the world. Thanks to the sun and rain for its prosperity. The petroleum resources of Roumania amounted to no less than 4,000,000,000 tons, which, at a net price of twelve shillings per ton, represented a value of \$12,400,000,000. The greatest annual output was that of 1,129,097 tons in 1907, and there are today nearly \$50,000,000 invested in the Rumanian petroleum industry.

BY-LAWS

Allowing Discount City of Charlottetown

A By-law for allowing the rate of discount on the Assessment on Real Estate and Personal Property in the City of Charlottetown, for general Civic purposes, for the current year ending the 31st day of December, A. D., 1909.

Be it enacted by the City Council of the City of Charlottetown, as follows:—

1st. A Discount, at the rate of Two and One half per cent (2 1/2 pc) shall be allowed to all Taxpayers who shall, on or before the 20th day of July, A. D. 1909, pay the City Clerk, at his office, the Taxes severally due by them for the current year on Real Estate and Personal Property for Civic purposes.

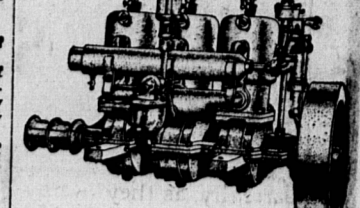

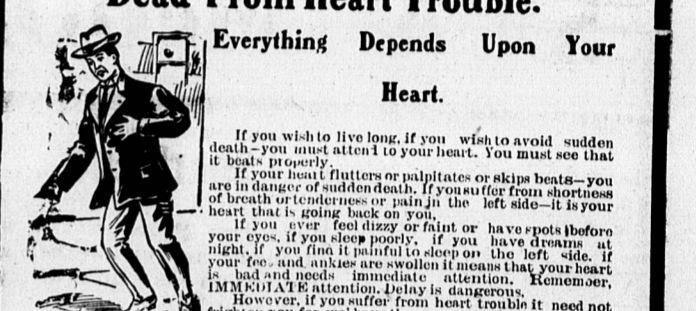
