Written on the base are the two last lines of that well known evening hymn of the Church of England: "Then when Thy voice shall bid our conflict cease, call us, O Lord, to Thine Eternal Peace." Then follows the inscription: "To the Glory of God and in loving memory of Robert FitzGerald DeBlois, entered into rest May 31, 1903; and of his wife, Ethel Helen DesBrisay, entered into rest May 31, 1915.
