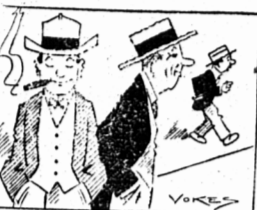

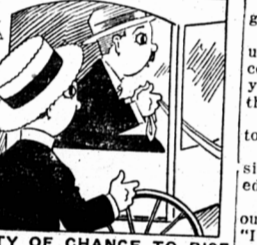

"I never thought to ask you—I'm so forgetful." "My fault," observed Morton, from the rear. "I was so glad to see them, never even thought about their comfort."

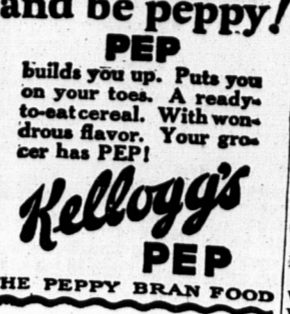
