Cahill, Summerside, was committed for trial earlier on the same charge.

NEW DELHI, May 16 - (CP) - After six years of active service in various theatres of war, more than 70,000 Indian Army animals are being "decommissioned."

Only about 13,000 horses and mules will be retained in the service.

Those animals certified fit by reconditioning and veterinary officers are being sold to provincial governments, local bodies and also to private individuals at auctions.

The agricultural department and certain government services are proving to be the Army's best customers.

Even in these days of mechanized warfare, animals have an important part to play. They were during the Burma campaign, when pack mules, pack ponies and even pack bullocks were used to maintain forward troops.

During the present onslaught in Imphal, 5,000 mules were flown in from the Arakan and helped roll back the Japanese invasion.

In the Arakan, mules shared the dangers and discomforts of the troops. They suffered many casualties, which were dealt with by the mobile hospitals of the Indian Army Veterinary Corps.
