Synopsis of Canadian North-West HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

ANY even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 36, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years of age to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less. Entry must be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land is situated. Entries must be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land is situated. A homesteader is required to perform the conditions connected therewith under one of the following plans: (1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years. (2) If the father or mother, if the father is not a member of the household resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for the homestead as to residence may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother. (3) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land. Six months' notice in writing should be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands in Ottawa when intending to depart.

THE MANCHURIAN BORDER TROUBLES

PEKIN, Aug. 21.—Japan's consent to the establishment of a customs house at Port Dalny is apparently conditional on Russia's consent to establish a custom house on the Manchurian border. Russia appears to be unwilling to bind herself to make the Manchurian arrangements desired by Japan. If Port Dalny remains a free port it will greatly damage the business of Niu Chwang, heretofore the base of all British and American trade in Manchuria.

EDITOR'S MAIL. THE MACDONALD CONSOLIDATED SCHOOL.

Sir.—Albert Ings wishes to know how the registers are kept at the Consolidated School, and charges that mistakes have occurred during the past term. Let a false impression should get abroad and be attended with evil consequences to the school, this letter is written. As the specific charge made had reference to my register, Principal Jones has a keed me to answer it, and at the same time state a few facts about the attendance which may be of interest to the public.

The registers are kept in this school just as in other schools. Each teacher keeps his or her own register and is prepared to take oaths that its contents are to the best of his or her knowledge correct. The registers are obtained at the education office and are in general use on the Island. My register shows that Master Earle Ings attended 114 out of 121 days. Mr. Ings is evidently mistaken when he says that Earle attended 123 days since there were not that many days in the term. Now we shall proceed to "give honor to whom honor is due" and so append a list of those who have attended most regularly, giving at the same time the distance from the home of the pupil to the school.

EDITOR'S MAIL. RAGWORT ON THE ROAD SIDE AND COMMONS

Sir:—Every public spirited man in this Province must commend the action of the leading newspapers in persistently advising our farmers to destroy Ragwort. That every farmer should destroy every plant that appears in his fields, is conceded by all, but what about the millions of plants that are growing on the roadsides, in stump lands in the heart of the woods, and in those farms the owners of which have torn down the fences and have gone themselves to serve foreign task masters while the land that their fathers cleared grows up to weeds and becomes a constant menace to agriculture. I know a man who has fought ragwort for many years, and whose farm is seeded anew from the neighbors fields, the roadside and a nearby common every year. Now, in my judgment, the Provincial or Dominion Dept. of Agriculture must undertake to clean up this pest from these waste places for a few years. A small amount of money spent now would do it, and if it is not done it will mean the loss of many cattle and the overrunning of the Province with this worst of all weeds.
