Nazis In Balkans In Serious Plight

ROME, Sept. 8 — (AP) — Allied arms have sprung one of the biggest traps of the war on 250,000 Germans unable to quit Yugoslavia and Greece because of co-ordinated aerial bombing and sabotage which has wrecked all main rail escape routes.

R. C. A. F. Head Overseas On Visit To Ottawa

OTTAWA, Sept. 8 — (C P) — Air Marshal L. S. Bredner, air officer commanding in chief of the R. C. A. F. overseas, returned to Ottawa today in a Giant Liberator that made history by flying non-stop from London to Ottawa.

Arrival of the plane engendered a series of rumors that Mr. Churchill had arrived in Canada on his way to his forthcoming conference with President Roosevelt. The rumors were denied, however, by officials of the nearby Rockcliffe airport where the plane returned and by those who met the plane.

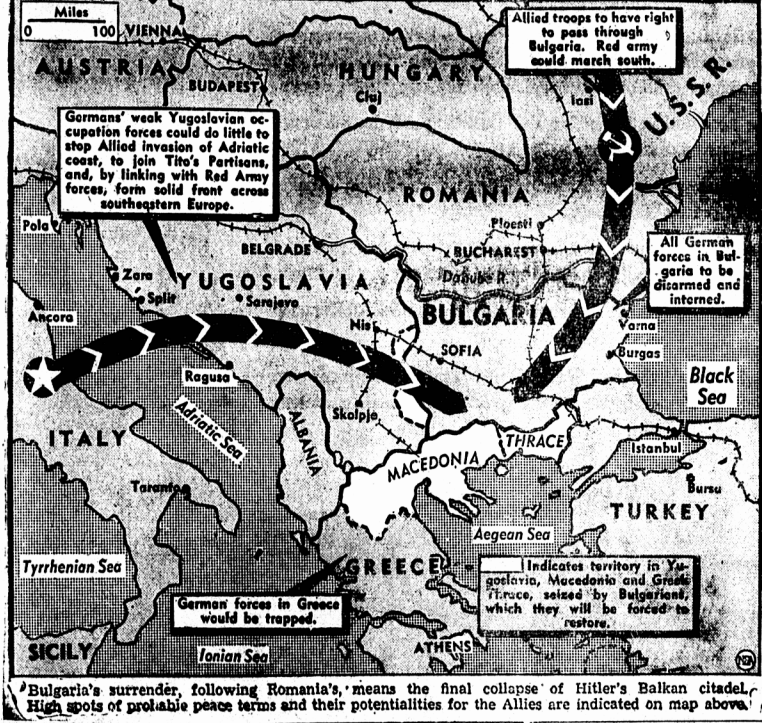
Le Havre Captured?

Four Allied Armies Get Set For Drive

LONDON, Sept. 8 — (CP) — Gen. Eisenhower swung four Allied armies against the Siegfried Line for a knockout punch today and a dispatch from the invasion commander's headquarters declared the end for Germany may come by early November.

The United States 1st Army seized the Belgian fortresses of Liege and pressed on three miles to within 18 miles of the German frontier as British and Netherlands forces burst across the Albert Canal and drove another five miles to within 25 miles of the border.

Slow Progress With Car Ferry

Peters, who was about twenty-four years of age, enlisted at the very outbreak of war in the Signals Corps, and went overseas with his unit in 1941.

Lieut. A. D. Taylor Of Kensington Killed In Action

Lieut. Arnold D. Taylor of the West Nova Scotia Regiment was killed in action in Italy on August 31, his next of kin were informed yesterday by the Department of National Defence. Lieut. Taylor was the only son of Mr. and Mrs. W. F. Taylor of Kensington. His wife, the former Annella MacDonald and a young daughter reside at Grandview, St. John's.

2,000 Allied Heavy Bombers Out Yesterday
