POPULAR APPOINTMENT.—The Dominion Express Co. have opened an agency at Vernon Station, E.C. White, Station Master, has been appointed agent. This office has been long needed at Vernon and will prove a great convenience to those having occasion to make use of the express business.

YES BUT UNSANITARY.—The watering place on Great George Street is in many respects a good thing but it has its drawbacks and its dangers. There are complaints that horses affected with strangles and other infectious diseases are sometimes watered there and that they leave the infection for others. This may or may not be so but in any case the font should be made sanitary, otherwise its benefits are outweighed by its dangers.

The Saturday races which, The Guardian understands, are to be regular features during the winter, could be made much more attractive and profitable if horsemen and merchants would get together and arrange for special trains on these days. At this season of the year farmers and others are just looking for an excuse to come to Charlottetown. Why not give it?

A LARGE FUNERAL.—The funeral of the late Rev. John Hawley which took place Monday at Marshfield was very largely attended. Rev. A. Robertson, John D. Ferguson and W. J. Gibson.

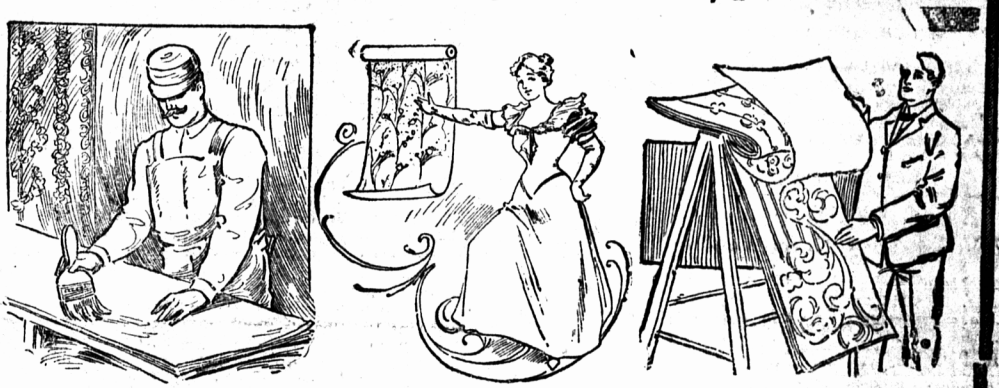
