POLITICAL NOTES.

The St. John Globe mentions the fact that it was twenty-five years to a day from the formation of the Blair Ministry in New Brunswick on 3rd March 1883 to the defeat of the Robinson Ministry on March 3, 1908.

The Senate, too, is very strongly Liberal in its present complexion, there being not more than 30 Conservatives in a total membership of 57.

A CANADIAN CLUB.

There is some talk of establishing a Canadian Club in Charlottetown and we are glad to learn that the project is likely to take definite shape at an early day.

The defeated Government in New Brunswick recommended half a dozen appointments after their defeat which Lieutenant Governor Tweedie declined to sanction.

Much has been printed in the Liberal press as to the difficulty Premier Hazen would have in forming a new administration, but this seems to have been mere empty talk.

There is much comment in the city and Province as well as outside on the rejection of the bill by the majority in the Island Legislature.

Word comes from Ottawa that Dr. Thompson, the hitherto independent member of the Commons for York, has formally announced that he will hereafter give his support to the Opposition leader.

Sir Wilfrid Laurier was placed in power in 1896 with a majority of 34. In the election of 1900 his majority was increased to 53 and in 1904 it was further increased to 63.

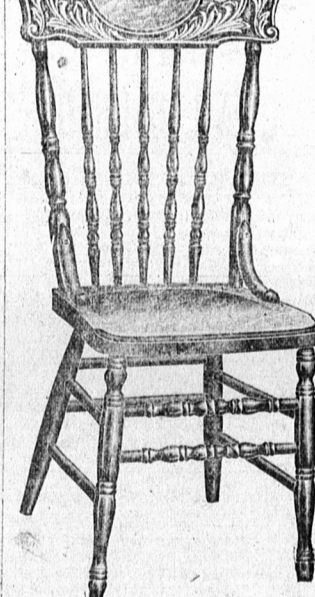
