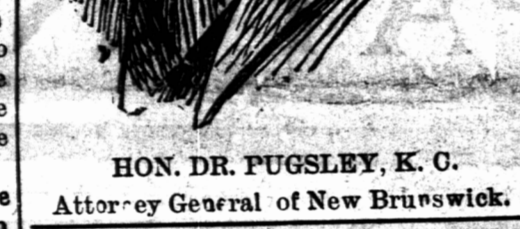
Nova Scotia to be Buried With Orange Honors

The Commons Seats Adhering to County Boundaries

How Nova Scotia and Ontario Will Be Affected--Rural Ridings Loose--The Georgian Bay Canal.

RE-DISTRIBUTION IN NOVA SCOTIA. OTTAWA, March 27--(Special)--Under the Redistribution Bill, in Nova Scotia, Pictou will lose one member and Victoria and Cape Breton Counties will be joined together and return one member.

THE EFFECT IN ONTARIO. County boundaries will be observed every where and this will mean most in re-adjusting in Ontario, where the old rural districts will lose nine members.
