KING'S COLLEGE GOVERNORS.
HALIFAX, Dec. 11.—A meeting of the governors of King's College was held today. The meeting lasted about nine hours' discussing a motion to give notice of dismissal to the president and faculty of the university, which was rejected by a large majority. The motion was made in the interests of those opposing federation with Dalhousie, and the vote seems to show that the federalists on the board of governors are as strong as ever they were. Rev. S. Weston Jones reported he had raised \$2,400 for the college to keep it as it now is.
