Cheerful letter From Bristol

The following cheerful communication has been received by Premier Campbell from an old friend and former classmate, Prof. C. M. MacLennan of the University of Bristol, England.

"Dear Thane, Christmas cards are not being sent this year but I feel I should still like to keep in contact with my friends in Canada, the United States, South Africa, New Zealand, Australia, India, etc. I am elsewhere and so I am having one general letter duplicated and copies sent to a lot of people.

"I will think always be remembered by us in Bristol, and not altogether with feelings of pain and regret. This grand old city has suffered grievously and some of its citizens have lost their lives, but for me the most lasting memory will be the steadfastness and courage of the people. When I say this I am not speaking without certain knowledge because, in an official capacity which I need not specify here, I have been brought into close contact with the people in their post-blast periods and there is no doubt of their splendid quality.

"One thing Canadians and Americans might like to know is the gratitude of Bristol people for the generous gifts which they have received from thousands of unknown friends beyond the Atlantic. For some of the most distressed people of the world, the gifts were a real blessing.
