YARMOUTH, July 12.—Charles Pinckney, of Melbourne, in this county, successfully underwent one of the most, if not the most, remarkable operations, ever performed by medical science in the Peter Brigham hospital, Boston, a few days ago. For some months past Mr. Pinckney had been suffering from what was supposed to be paralysis. As the disease grew worse he was advised to go away for treatment. He went to Boston and entered the hospital, where a most rigid examination by means of the X-ray and other devices was made, but nothing could be found. They advised an operation and he consented, with the result that Dr. Harvey Cushing, assisted by Professor Connelman, the great pathologist, have made the mark of a new era in medical science. An incision was made near the spine and the fifteenth vertebra was removed, but no obstruction was found. This was repeated on the sixth and seventh and on the eighth and still nothing was discovered. Fearing that the continuance of the operation along those lines would prove fatal, that process was stopped and a probe was brought into use which located an obstruction at the fourth vertebra. On removing this section of the spine a small tumor the size of an orange was found pressing against the spinal cord. This was taken away and now Mr. Pinckney is on the road to complete recovery.

A REMARKABLE AND SUCCESSFUL OPERATION

INVERMORE SANK RAPIDLY AFTER STRIKING A ROCK. ST. JOHN'S, Nfld., July 11.—All of the passengers on the coastal steamer Invermore, which struck on the rocks near Brig Harbor Point, on the Labrador coast, last night, were landed safely today. Messages received here from the scene of the wreck said that the steamer filled rapidly after striking, and was today resting on the rocks with only her top deck above water. The Invermore struck while trying to avoid the heavy ice.
