SAINT JOHN, N. B., May 6.—(C.P.)—Here's a new one. John Wardell, who resides near Little River, reports that while out walking he was amazed to see a white bull moose, accompanied by a cow moose.

"I've never heard of albino moose being seen," he commented. "This bull had a big circular black spot on one side. The two animals stood still and looked at me for a minute, and then loped away quickly. I've seen plenty of moose and deer, even some white deer and white coyotes, and I know a moose when I see one. I've known instances of moose coming into graze with cattle, and there is a possibility of this animal being the result of mixed mating."

Commissioner Is Not Paid Salary

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld., May 6.—(C.P.) Beyond providing office facilities for the Royal Commission now investigating the "future possibilities" of Newfoundland, the government will not be called upon to meet any of the expenses incidental to its work.

This was stated in the legislature in reply to questions from opposition members.

The commission, appointed by agreement after Canada and Great Britain assisted Newfoundland in meeting bond interest the first of the year, began its work in March and is expected to report before the presents session of the legislature is concluded.

Lord Amulree, the chairman, represents Great Britain; C. A. McGrath of Toronto, represents Canada, and Sir William Stavert, Newfoundland.

What financial arrangements had been made by Canada and Great Britain with their representatives was not stated in the return to the legislature but it announced that Sir William Stavert was acting without salary. "The only payment to be made to him being in respect to his out of pocket expenses."

In accepting the appointment, Sir William stipulated that he should receive no salary.

(Special to the Guardian) MONCTON, N. B. May 6—Announcement is made of abolishment of the position of superintendent of shop methods, Canadian National Railways, and the duties formerly performed by the official who held that position, E. R. Battley have been taken over by Frank Williams, mechanical engineer in charge of shop methods. Mr. Battley was recently transferred to the Central Region as General Superintendent of Motive Power and Car Equipment. Mr. Frank Williams is well known to railwaymen in the Maritimes, particularly around Moncton, where he was employed by the railway as mechanical engineer prior to his transfer to Montreal on December 21, 1929. He entered the service of the railway as a draftsman at Moncton October 28, 1914, and on July 31, 1916, left the service to enter munition work in connection with the Great War. He returned to the railway service on January 31, 1918, as draftsman at Moncton and on May 1, 1920, was appointed mechanical designer and on April 21, 1923, mechanical engineer.

CROP REPORT

Below will be found a brief synopsis of telegraphic reports received at the Head Office of the Bank of Montreal from its Branches. The Branch Managers have complete and intimate knowledge of each local situation and are in close touch with crop conditions in all sections of the districts mentioned.

GENERAL

Owing to a backward spring agricultural operations throughout the Dominion have been delayed from one to three weeks later than usual, but conditions in other respects, especially in regard to moisture, are generally favourable.

PRAIRIE PROVINCES

Alberta Northeastern Area—Little seeding has yet been done. In the Maritime Provinces little work has been done on the land except in the southern part of Nova Scotia, where early spring is reported.

PROVINCE OF QUEBEC

Cold weather has retarded Spring operations, which are later than usual. Pastures appear to have wintered well. The run of maple syrup was small but of good quality.

PROVINCE OF ONTARIO

Seeding operations, which were delayed by cold, damp weather, have now become fairly general except in the eastern section of the province, where the season is about ten days late. Orchards have wintered without any apparent damage and early indications are favourable.

MARITIME PROVINCES

The season generally is about two weeks later than usual, and seeding will not be general before the 15th May. Only about half of an average year's acreage of potatoes will be planted.

PROVINCE OF BRITISH COLUMBIA

There is an ample supply of moisture and the soil is in good condition. It is expected there will be a slight reduction in the acreage sown to wheat. Tomato acreage will be increased about 30 per cent; the acreage planted to potatoes will be considerably decreased.
