**Deanna Durbin 10th In Income List In The U. S.**

WASHINGTON, Dec. 12.—(CP)—Deanna Durbin, Winnie, born singer and film actress, was listed 10th on the United States Treasury report of big incomes topped by the name of Louis B. Mayer.

The name's estimate got \$806,070 from Loew's Inc., for personal services in one year, a supplement to an earlier partial listing of individuals' income from corporations disclosed. The report as a whole covers returns for the calendar year of 1945 and fiscal years ending in 1943 and 1944.

Ranking immediately after Mr. Mayer in honor by nearly \$500,000 were Charles E. Wilson, General Motors executive, and Thomas J. Watson, International Business Machines executive.

Following is the list of the 20 individuals who, according to the treasury statement, received the greatest income from corporations for personal services in one year:

**Reiterate British Position In Java**

LONDON, Dec. 12.—(CP Cable)—British troops sent to Java on a rescue mission to aid prisoners of war and internees cannot withdraw until some understanding is reached between the Dutch and Indonesian Nationalists, informed British sources reiterated today.

It is understood here that Dutch troops are not being used in skirmishing with the Indonesian Nationalists because the British authorities, as intermeddlers, are seeking to do all possible to prevent the Dutch-Indonesian clashes as these would make a settlement more difficult.

Apart from police work and seeking for peace between the Dutch and the Indonesians the primary task of the British forces is to ensure the safety of up to 200,000 internees, mostly women and children. Allied prisoners of war not yet cleared from the danger area also depend upon the British forces for their rescue.

In the eyes of British authorities, resistance to Allied relief forces and acts of terrorism are the work of irresponsible gangs of youths who were armed and trained ideologically and militarily by the Japanese during the occupation.

A substantial number of troops have been required to deal with the fighting Indonesians. Mr. Evin said it had been discovered that the Japanese had obeyed surrender orders and left military equipment in the hands of the Indonesian forces they trained. This situation involved the British troops in more extensive operations than were at first anticipated and the forces in Java have been stretched.

Maj. Gen. Yamamoto, Chief of Staff of the Japanese 16th Army, has admitted he was mainly responsible for fostering the Indonesian independence movement. Southeast Asia Command Headquarters said in Singapore. Yamamoto was in command of Japanese forces in Java. He was arrested and jailed last month, and is awaiting trial in Singapore.

"Yes, and will you ask Mr. Jerome?"

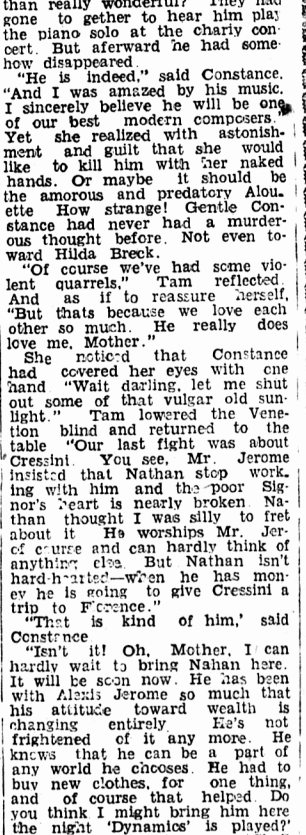
