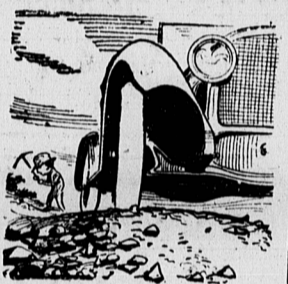

ROTARY CLUB—Rotary luncheon yesterday was well attended. Rotarian W. L. Prowse presided, and Rotarian Rowe gave an interesting two-minute talk on "A Rotarian's Duty towards the Schools of his City." The speaker of the day was Rotarian J. H. Malcom, whose subject, "The Land of the Heather," was a highly entertaining one. After a humorous skit on the Scottish character, Mr. Malcom went on to point out that among the nations which have done most to improve the world and make it a better place to live in, the front rank position must be given to Scotland. No land has had in history greater extremes of fortune and misfortune and perhaps in no other country has there been manifested more varieties of race. The Scot (whatever he was) the Gael with heart of flame, devoted and courageous; the Dane, wavering between loyalty and caution; and the hardy and adventurous Norseman, have all contributed their qualities. Despite the opinions of Sydney Smith and others who would not even admit that such an element existed in our "pale, cauld country," Sandy has a very keen sense of wit and humor. The speaker told a number of stories setting forth various phases of Scottish character. Patriotism is a predominant trait and has not doubt been developed in the many fights for freedom which Scotland has gone through in the days gone by. The great epoch in Scottish history has been her struggle for independence. The tragedy of William Wallace deepened and intensified the national feeling. It was against tremendous odds that Bruce led his hosts at Bannockburn ridge. The speaker concluded by tracing the strong patriotic feeling running through Scottish war songs, referring particularly to the songs, poetry, of Burns and Scott.
