The interesting bowling match took place recently at the Arena Bowling Alleys when the Railway Mail Clerks won from the Mail Carrier's Team. The first game was a victory for the clerks by 63, the second was also won by the clerks by 22 while the carriers won out in the third by 51, leaving a total majority for the clerks of 40.

There is a good deal of objectionable loitering done around the City Building which is the source of a number of complaints recently heard on this point. Last night quite a small congregation gathered there and their loud talking and other actions did not add to the attractiveness of the seat of City Justice. The offenders imagined themselves to be outside the reach of the law or maybe they think the city building is their protection even when violating by laws passed between the very walls overshadowing them. Either of these contentions are bound to lead up to a misunderstanding with the officials should the nuisance continue.

G. LeLacheur, Ex-Principal of the MacDonald Consolidated School, is undertaking the preliminary survey of a hundred farms in the province for the Public Lands Committee of the Commission on Conservation. His farm experience supplemented by two years with Professors Zavitz and Klink of crop and soil fame should give him the necessary qualifications for his work. The Public Lands Committee, of which Dr Jas W. Robertson is chairman, seeks information regarding rotation of crops and the prevalence of weeds, insect pests and plant diseases. The water supply in relation to the public health and the sources of heat, power and light on the farm, will also be enquired into. The scope and object of this work will be discussed at Hillsboro on August 9th and at Summerside on August 10th, where meetings for rural people will be addressed by Dr Jas. W. Robertson and members of the Commission. The courtesy of all farmers visited should be extended to Mr LeLacheur. He is now at work in Lot 28.

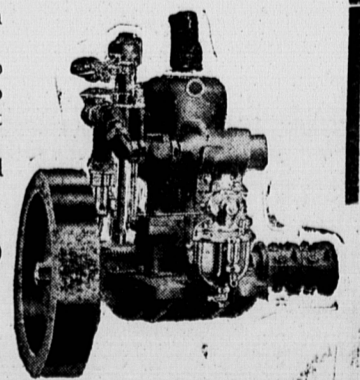
