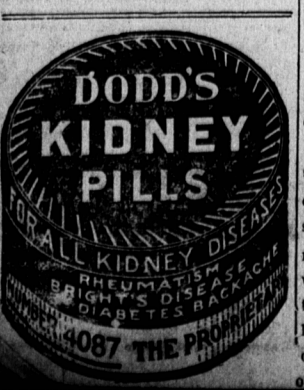

A goodly number of our best foxes should be sent to the Toronto fair if only to make certain that the prestige of our fox-breeder is maintained.

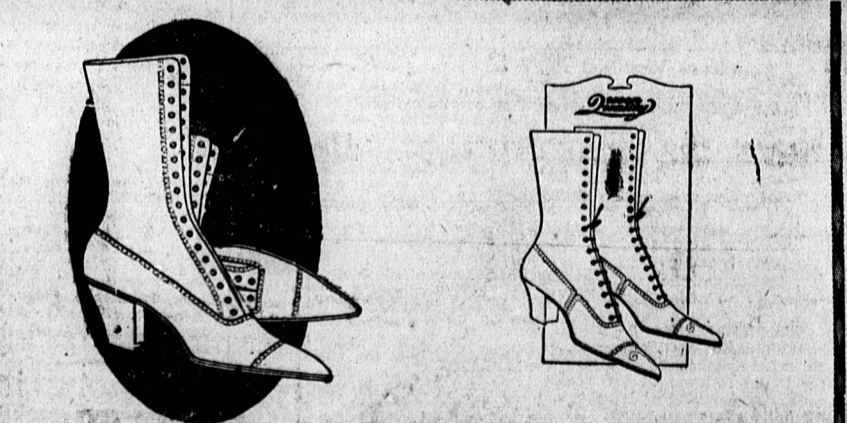
