PROSECUTOR Jenkins of Charlottetown scored the greatest success of his official career in the police court on Saturday when he secured third offence convictions against Harry Connolly and Andrew Doyle, has another practically clinched against a third party and set a \$100 fine for first offences on each of two others. As the third offences are punishable by six months imprisonment without the option of a fine, the parties thus convicted leave the province, rather than go down for six months. He has already scored against four of the oldest and most persistent offenders, and it is believed his prosecutions will be crowned with success which will result in putting these parties permanently out of the liquor business in Charlottetown. Mr. Jenkins has on the string a large number of persons against whom he has secured first and second offences, and upon whom he is patiently waiting to fasten the dreaded third offence.—Sydney Record.

THE reopening of the Kingston Baptist house of worship was carried out Sunday, October 11th. An alcove added in the rear, contains the pulpit platform and choir gallery. The entire arrangement being very pretty and convenient. This portion of the building is adorned with elegant hanging lamps, a gift from the sons of the late Deacon William Ward, as a memorial to the life of their father, who for years was a faithful office bearer, and Superintendent of the Sunday School. Commodious horse sheds have been erected on the southern side of the church. On account of the storm in the afternoon and evening, the opening will be continued Sunday afternoon and evening, October 25. Due notice will be given of the preachers at these meetings.

mentioned interests are jeopardized, the two Governments will communicate with one another fully and frankly.

Article VI—Provides that the agreement come into effect immediately, remain in force for five years and be binding for a year after either party denounced it. But if, when the date fixed for the expiration of the agreement arrives, either party thereto is actually engaged in war, the alliance shall, ipso facto, continue until peace is concluded.

The agreement is signed by Lord Lansdowne and Baron Hayaashi, the Japanese Minister to Great Britain.
