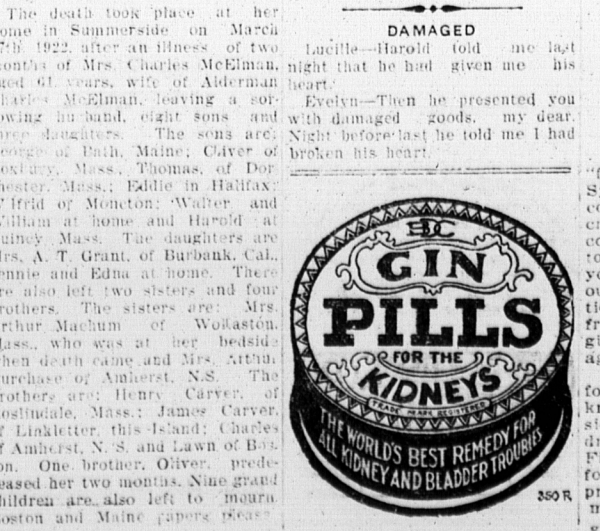

Sad Fatality At Rustico

A sad fatality occurred at North Rustico on Saturday by which Peter Pineau, son of Joseph M. Pineau lost his life. On Saturday night between 10 and 11 o'clock while the young man, who is about thirty years of age, in company with Raymond Gallant, was working at a gasoline torch, which they were using in soldering a water tank in the house, the torch exploded and Pineau received the full contents of the explosion.

The unfortunate young man, who was quickly a mass of flames, made a dash for the kitchen. The porch where the work was being done also caught fire, and Gallant, not knowing of Pineau's predicament, thought the fire in the porch after he had extinguished it, returned to look for Pineau and found him still on fire in the kitchen. Gallant then seized a small mat and tried to smother the fire on Pineau's clothing, but without success, and forced by the raging flames, both young men were compelled to run outside.

Ray Gallant, almost overcome with his hands terribly burned, succeeded in smothering the flames on Pineau's clothing, but to no avail. Gallant's father, hearing the shouting looked out the window and seeing the burning man, snatched up a mat and ran to his assistance, extinguishing the fire almost instantly, but not before the fire in Pineau's clothing had taken hold.

The brave young fellow although so fatally burned walked upstairs to bed alone.

Dr. McKenna was immediately summoned and arriving in a short time did everything possible for the young man, but he passed away yesterday at noon after receiving the rites of the Catholic Church.

Dr. McLaughlin arrived shortly after the young man had died and decided an inquest unnecessary. Raymond Gallant who was also badly burned, in his heroic effort to save his friend, is getting along as well as can be expected.

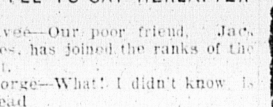

Army Officers Are Less Fit Physically

WASHINGTON, March 25—Physical examination of regular army officers now in progress has disclosed the most clear cut evidence of physical deterioration since the "strain incident" of the previous year. The examination, which is the first of its kind in the history of the War Department office, is based on information from reports from examining officers.

An outstanding feature noted by attending surgeons in making the annual physical examination of all officers, including general officers, was the persistently large percentage of officers showing either excessive high or abnormally low blood pressure, according to Surgeon Gen. Ireland's report to Major Gen. Harbord, deputy chief of staff. The doctors are now rushed with this examination work as the requirement was omitted last year and a two-year accumulation of symptoms must be dealt with.

Analysis of the records, Gen. Ireland said, "will probably show that physical deterioration was more marked in the commissioned personnel of the regular army than in the emergency forces, because a relatively larger percentage of the former was charged with greater responsibilities, including extensive travel, both mental and physical."
