SCOTLAND IN FIGURES

HER REPORT VERY GOOD KEEPS ABREAST OF BRITAIN

Historic Those who cling to the belief that Scotland is nearly in the shade are greatly mistaken. She keeps well up with her own past and is moving ahead again. In this we speak only of the agricultural status. Twenty years ago she held her own at \$4.108. per acre proceeds and \$3.78. 6d per acre in all agricultural statistics, Britain included. The total number of farm holdings in Scotland is given for 1927 as 78,346 of which 57,255 were between 50 and 100 acres, the remainder being classified as 1 to 5 acres. In 1925 the number given was 76,761 of which 50,536 did not exceed 50 acres and 100 acres, 17,026 were not above 5 acres and 18,495 were between 5 and 15 acres. The number of males engaged in agricultural work according to the Decennial Census of population in 1857 was 211,000. In 1878 and in 1921 140,265, a decrease of 33.5 per cent from the year 1851. The number of females in 1871 (including re-

The Land We Love. By Frank Yeigh. LIGHTHOUSES IN CANADA. Q. When were the first lighthouses built in Canada? A. The first Lighthouse erected in Canada was at Louisburg, Cape Breton, in 1784, by the French Commander, which carried a light that was visible for six leagues out at sea. The first lighthouse erected in Halifax Harbour was the Sambro, in 1768, for which a lottery was proposed to raise the cost. There are today over 8000 lighthouses and marine light stations under the control of the Government Marine Department. Canada ranks high in her aids to navigation.
