FRENCH PREMIER VERY CONFIDENT

"I Slept Last Night and Slept Well" He Remarks.

PARIS, April 2.—Reports of yesterday's operations are encouraging in two places, reinforcing the calm confidence which is felt here. First was the plainly marked check with which the Germans met in their attempt to extend the battle north of Arras. The second feature is the effective and increasing reaction on the part of the Allies, resulting in important successes, particularly in the region of Montdidier.
