**BIG BUSINESS.**—Last night the P. E. Island Railway handled 10,000 lbs. of baggage of which the largest amount was owned by commercial travellers. This morning a large part of this baggage had to be held over owing to the rush, which goes to show the large amount of business being done on the Island and the large passenger traffic carried on by the P.E.I.R.

**DESTROYED LOBSTER TRAPS.**—The government steamer J. L. Nelson, Capt. Wrayton, which has been on lobster protection service around Prince Edward Island, has returned to the marine and fisheries headquarters in Halifax. During her summer's work she destroyed over 1400 lobster traps, which were set in violation of the regulations. The Nelson will be in service for the marine and fisheries agency in Halifax for the winter.

**SMART PASSAGE.**—The Black Diamond liner Morwenna arrived in Sydney Wednesday after an exceedingly smart passage from Montreal via Summerside and Charlottetown, P.E.I. In spite of boisterous and uncertain winds the first class passenger and cargo steamer kept promptly to her schedule itinerary. After discharging cargo for Sydney port and North Sydney, she left overnight for St. John's, Nfld., to which port the balance of her freight is consigned.

**PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND.**—The following is from the Census and Statistics Monthly. The crops generally have been saved in good condition, the only exception being corn which has been more or less of a failure. The hay crop turned out better than was expected. Wheat is above the average although injured somewhat by smut and joint rot. Oats on the whole are well filled and free from rust and blight. Local frosts on the 5th and 8th injured corn and potatoes. The latter however will be a fairly good crop.

**PROFITABLE MEETING.**—At Meadowbank the monthly meeting of the Women's Institute was a very helpful one as shown by the varied program carried out. The first topic dealt with was apples, each member giving different recipes for using the same; the picking and storing of apples as well as the storage of various garden vegetables. For winter use were also discussed and in addition, the care of dahlias bulbs through the winter. Afterward the president in an earnest talk urged the members to further work the greater interest in the society, so that in their section they might have one of the banner Women's Institutes of the province.
