DUMONT'S PROJECTED AIRSHIP.

Man at first plodded the earth on foot with weary feet, with even poorer means of locomotion than the wild creatures of the earth. Then he made the horse carry him. Then he built the chariot for his greater comfort, and built him highways. After thousands of years he made railways, on which drawn by a steed of iron he could speed swiftly as the bird in its flight. On the water he made like progress from the log to the raft, from the raft to the boat with oars and then with sails, from the boat to the galley, from the galley to the sailing ship, from the sailing ship to the swift steamer, which defying wind and tide speeds its way through daylight and midnight darkness across the broadest ocean. Thus having conquered the dominion of the land and sea until he could outrace the swiftest creatures of the land or the water, there still remained the vast domain of air, in which the birds with soaring wing made mockery of the self styled lord of the creation. He has sought with untiring search the means to fly, and like the fledgling in its first feeble and awkward flutterings he is slowly and with infinite concern and danger acquiring the new and marvellous power.

The step is a vast one. Its full consummation means more to man than to the young eagle which one day "cribbed and cabined and confined," helpless in the maternal nest, finds itself within a few weeks soaring beyond the mountaintops. It means more because of man's higher intelligence, and because his intelligence and faith have told him that he is no mere creature of the earth but a citizen of the universe and akin to the intelligences of other worlds than this. Nearly a hundred years ago man in eager search of the power of flight learned to lift himself into the air by means of gas lighter than air imprisoned in a balloon. But through a century little further progress was made. The siege of Paris in 1871 gave a great impetus to ballooning. Fifty four balloons in succession carried out from the beleaguered city many passengers and two and a half million letters, the latter weighing an aggregate of ten tons. It was then that the first effort was made to create the appliances for a dirigible balloon—one that could be directed more or less out of the direction of the wind, which was still the only motive power for the air ship.

The application of motive power to balloons is a matter of the past few years, culminating in the airship of Santos Dumont, the young Brazilian millionaire, who recently navigated his aerial vessel from a hilltop into Paris, around the Eiffel Tower and returned safely and quickly to the place of departure. While the world is yet ringing with his great achievement Dumont has projected another larger and more powerful airship. That in which he made his last successful experiment was known as Number Six, being the sixth of the series he has constructed. Its motor was of 16 horse power and weighed about 200 pounds. Number Seven now to be constructed will be of 21 horse power and will weigh 600 pounds. With a little more than twice the weight of his former motor he will have over five times the power. Dumont estimates that his new airship will be able to carry fuel enough for a ten hour's flight. He hopes moreover under ordinary circumstances to make a speed of thirty miles an hour.

So great is the interest in the new airship that the Prince of Monaco has offered to pay the entire cost of construction, but for that matter Dumont himself has abundant means, and if that were not so there are millions of capital ready to back any venture in which the great aerial navigator has expressed his confidence. So we take it as more than possible that we are at the beginning of the age—one of the most remarkable in the history of the race—in which men are to navigate the air, it may be with something of the freedom and the certainty with which today they make their way across the sea.

Platinum, one of the rarest and most valuable of metals, is now reported to have been discovered in the Yukon country.
