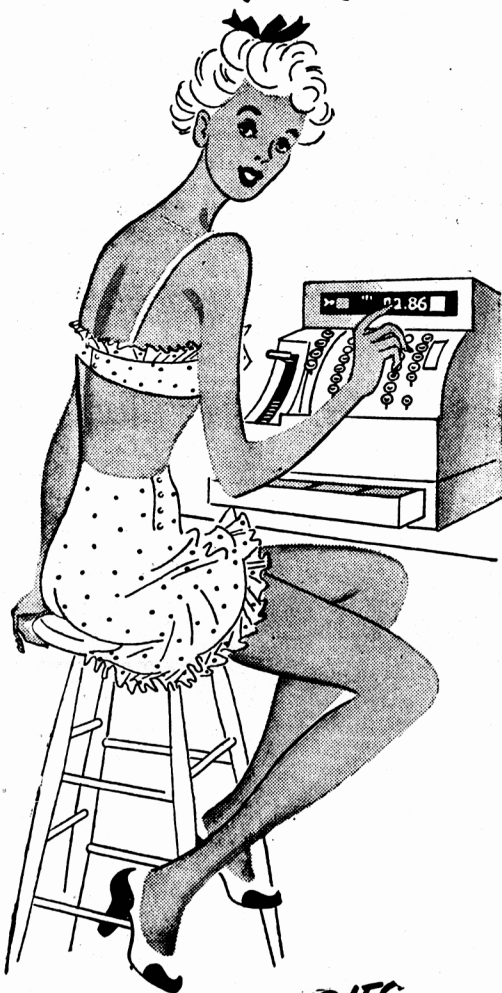

SOUR CREAM COOKIES

deg. Fahr. (very hot) for about 15 minutes if 1/2-inch thick. Serve warm wrapped in napkin.

One cup sour cream, 1 cup sugar, 1 beaten egg, 2 1/2 to 3 cups sifted flour, 1 teaspoon baking soda, 1/2 teaspoon each nutmeg, cinnamon and salt, 1/2 cup raisins or chopped nuts or a combination of both. Cream the sour cream and sugar together. Sift together all the dry ingredients, then sift them into the cream and sugar mix. Stir in fruit or nuts. Drop by teaspoons on greased baking sheet and bake at 400 deg. Fahr. for about 10 minutes. If liked stiffer, add another 1/2 cup sifted flour.
