POWNAL ELIMINATED BY MT. STEWART TEAM

Winners Shoot Three Goals In Last Four Minutes To Qualify For County Final

MT. STEWART ROYALS last night advanced to the final for the Queen's County intermediate hockey title against Milton Horns when they outfought and at times outskated Pownal P. A. A. to win the second game of the series 5-3 and take the round by a score of 8-5 after winning the opening encounter 3-2.

Starting away at a fast clip Weir got his first goal on a pass from McDonald; four minutes later Someriet Kelly fired a long drive from the line into the cage for a 2-0 lead with the losers replying a minute later with their first goal.
