Canadian Railways Canadian railways which reported June net earnings yesterday, showed the most satisfactory results for any months this year to date. The improvement was due entirely to a reduction in operating expenses. In the case of the C. P. R. as well as the C. N. R. the reduction in operating expenses was practically as large as the drop in gross earnings, with the result that the decrease in net was relatively small. C. P. R. net of \$2,820,082 was the highest for any month this year to date, and while it was somewhat under the figure for the corresponding period of 1929 and 1928, it is interesting to note that it was higher than the net earnings for June of 9 of the preceding 17 years. Due to the sharp decreases in the first 5 months of 1930 the net for the first half of 1930 still shows a heavy decrease, being down 42 percent as compared with the like period of 1929. With the exception of the first half of 1925, the earnings for the first six months of 1930 were the lowest for any corresponding period back to 1912. The show for June is highly encouraging.
