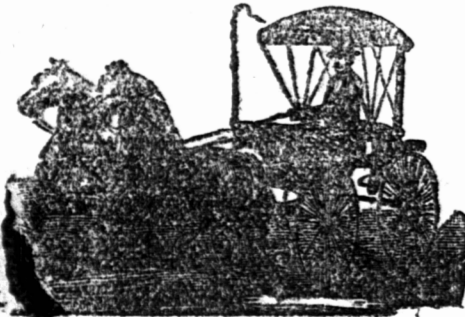

Twenty-two years ago, August 14, 1879 the Marquis of Lorne and Princess Louise arrived in Charlottetown.

In Saint John a number of citizens have joined in a complaint to the police court against the Salvation Army for making too much noise on the streets and about their barracks. The complainants appear to be good citizens who recognize the excellent work done by the Army in many ways, but think the war against the Prince of Darkness might be waged quite as energetically without disturbing the sleep of persons who are ill or nervous. Some six witnesses were examined and the case was then adjourned for a week in order that more witnesses may be summoned.

Much ado is made by the American press over a Boer prisoner who escaped from Bermuda, hid among the coal on board a steamer and is now in New York. His offence being political he is not extraditable. Few will grudge the fellow his hard-earned liberty. It appears that he was one of the thousands who were captured with Cronje and would have been sent to St. Helena but for the fact that he was afflicted with rheumatism. But for his illness he would now be safe in Napoleon's old-time prison.

London, Ont., News tells us, that city has made no preparation to receive the Duke and Duchess of Cornwall, because of the uncertainty whether the Royal party will visit that place. This seems strange in view of the fact London is the fourth Ontario city in population and importance. The News says the City Council have only to say so and the Duke will visit London. There may be much in this. We really wonder whether our Provincial Government have wisely and energetically done their best to bring the Royal party here. So far it appears that they are not coming and it is a sad disappointment to many thousands of our people.

The Chicago Tribune is authority for the statement that the Endowment Rank of the Supreme Lodge, Knights of Pythias have decided to increase the insurance rates about 51 per cent. A table given by the Tribune of the old and new rates for \$1,000 insurance shows that at age 21 the old rate was 70 cents and the new rate 1.05 cents per month; at age 30, 1.25 cents and 1.75; at age 40 the old rate was \$1.10 and is raised to \$1.75, while at age 50 the old rate of \$1.60 is raised to \$2.70. The same paper states that it is understood that "plans are afoot to hold together the thousands who are expected to secede and make them the nucleus of a new Pythian Insurance Order, to be conducted independently and free from the restraints imposed by Supreme Lodge control."

According to the serial, Mainly About People. Millionaire Carnegie is still old-fashioned enough to be in love with his wife, and their relations are as cordial and mutually satisfactory as those in Healed in the old song John Anderson My Jo.
