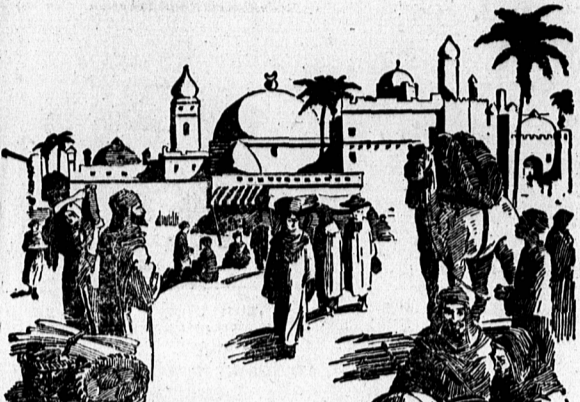

An Island Officer Is in Command

The Edmonton Bulletin of May 12th, says: Gunlayers, drivers and signallers of the 20th Brigade, Canadian Field artillery are now putting the finishing touches to their training in preparation for the artillery part of the year—the annual camp at Sarcee, when the Edmonton boys will ride and shoot in competition with batteries from all over the Dominion. The 20th has its headquarters in Edmonton and was only recently established; three batteries go to it's make up, to command the new unit, MAJOR H. H. STEPHENS has been given the rank of Lieutenant Colonel. Two batteries train in Edmonton—the 61st, with Major N. V. Buchanan, M. C., as the C. O., and the 92nd under Major J. H. Thompson. Major R. C. Lister, M.C., commands the third unit of the brigade, the 78th at Red Deer. All told the brigade totals twelve units, four being howitzers and the balance eighteen-pounders. All the equipment is essentially modern, and compared to the artillery equipment before the war, is as near perfection as can be attained.

Six horses go with each gun and the general appearance of the batteries at the armories. If he call goes out again for "the men who can shoot and ride" Edmonton will be ready to respond. The brigade goes to Sarcee camp on July 19th and will have eight days training there under active service conditions. Prizes are offered to gunlayers, drivers and signallers, but the entire camp personnel is limited to forty per cent of the battery establishment by the militia regulations, hence only men who are right up on their toes will be picked for the trip south.

105th to Camp on June 18th.
Word has been received that the 105th Battalion, P. E. I. Regiment, will go under canvas at the Ordinance Compound, Victoria Park on June 18th for thirteen days. The inspection will take place on the 29th. As in other military units, the camp this year will take the form of a camp school for the qualification of N. C. O.'s and officers.

Churches Inquiring Into Drug Traffic
TORONTO, May 22.—With Rev. Dr. T. Albert Moore presiding, the semi-annual meeting of the Inter-Church Advisory Council of Canada was held yesterday in the board rooms of the Wesley Building, Toronto. The Board is made up of the members of the departmental boards of the Congregational, Baptist, Methodist and Presbyterian churches of the Dominion. The out-of-town representatives attending included Principal Ritchie, of Montreal, and W. J. Atchison, of Hamilton. In a report presented by the committee on social services it reviewed the steps taken toward unifying the temperance forces of the Dominion. Reference was made to the meeting of the various temperance organizations held in Ottawa last February which had resulted in the organization of the Canadian Prohibition Society. The society have a united body working in behalf of all prohibition effort in the Federal field. The committee was instructed by the board to give consideration to the questions of the drug traffic and of the treatment of drug addicts.

Best Tennis Ever Seen in France
ST. CLOUD, France, May 21.—Gobert and Cochet, of France; Wasber, of Belgium; Count de Gomar, of Spain, and Wheatley, of Great Britain, appear today as having the best chance of reaching the finals against William M. Johnston, of California, in the men's singles after three days of play in the International hard court tennis championships.

The matches which Gobert won from Baron von Morhuze and Cochet defeated Italy, first ranking player of Italy, developed some of the best tennis ever seen in France. Johnston's defeat of Diemer-Kool, of Holland, was also interesting, although somewhat one-sided. He demonstrated his superiority over the Dutch champion by 6-3, 6-2, 4-6, 6-4.
