THE TARIFF QUESTION.

It is a noteworthy fact that Canada is the only manufacturing country in the world today in which there is a demand for a reduction in import duties.

is in Canada but provides that such dumping duty shall be an amount equal to the full difference between the full invoice price and the foreign market value or cost of production.

In May last the Spanish government passed a resolution favoring an increase of 100 per cent in its import duties with a view to building up the native industries.

In July last Switzerland increased its import duty on a long list of articles which the country manufactures.

Cost of the Coal Strike

Nobody is likely to be bold enough to estimate the cumulative losses to the nation now and in the months to come from the coal dispute.

If work begins next week (beginning June) the Government will have incurred the following, among other liabilities:

On subsidizing the industry, £10,000,000. Cost of mobilizing the Reserve and maintaining the Defense Force at least £6,000,000.

The mining industry will have lost, on the basis of the figures for the first quarter of the year:

In total commercial disposals, £67,000,000; in exports, £12,000,000.

The miners will have lost in wages, after allowing a margin for reductions as originally proposed, nearly £60,000,000.

Probably 4,000,000 workers are unemployed or on short time as a result of the stoppage, apart from other causes.
